Holy Week



April 5th: Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday falls one week before Easter Sunday. Christian worshipers celebrate the <u>triumphal entry of Jesus Christ</u> into Jerusalem, which took place the week before his <u>death</u> and <u>resurrection</u>. For many Christian churches, Palm Sunday, often referred to as Passion Sunday, marks the beginning of <u>Holy Week</u>, which concludes on Easter Sunday.

April 9th: Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday or Holy Thursday, the Thursday before the celebration of Easter Sunday. Maundy Thursday gets its name from the Latin word *mandatum*, which means "commandment." In the context of Holy Week it refers to the commandment Jesus gave to his disciples while washing their feet, as recorded in John 13. Specifically, the commandment in John 13:34-35:



April 10th: Good Friday

Good Friday is observed on the Friday before Easter Sunday. It is a day when people remember Jesus' death on the cross. Many people, mostly Christians, celebrate this day by attending a Good Friday service where they read the biblical accounts of Jesus' death on the cross. April 12th: Resurrection of the Lord/Easter Sunday

Easter, also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday, is a festival and holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day after his burial following his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary c. 30 AD

Key Takeaways

- In the Christian belief, according to Scripture (<u>Isaiah 53</u>), Jesus Christ is the promised Messiah and Savior of the World.
- The resurrection refers to Jesus coming back to life or being raised from the dead three days after his death on the cross.
- By laying down his life, Christians believe that Jesus paid the full penalty for sin, a perfect, spotless sacrifice.
- Subsequently, by raising from the dead, Jesus defeated the power of sin and death and purchased, for all who believe in him, eternal life in Christ Jesus.

A Message From The UPC Stewardship Committee

The UPC Stewardship Committee would like you to be aware that there are two methods for you to submit donations/pledges to United Presbyterian Church:

Method 1: You may **mail a check** to:

United Presbyterian Church of Plainfield 525 East Front Street Plainfield New Jersey 07060

Attention: UPC Stewardship Committee

Be certain to write the reason for the contribution (ex. weekly pledge, Deacon's fund, Easter offering etc.) in the "memo" or "for" section of the check to ensure your contribution gets correctly appropriated. For convenience, you might consider contacting your bank to request automatic payments from your account be made to United by check on weekly or monthly intervals. United's mail is being held at the Plainfield post office. The mail is picked up three times a week and deposits to United's bank account are done weekly.

Method 2: Using your credit card/Pay Pal

Visit United's website (www.upcplainfield.org). There, you will see a "Donate" button. You may make your contribution to United by clicking on that button and using your credit card. Funds contributed in this way are collected by PayPal and then distributed weekly to United's bank account. Please note that contributions made in this manner are subject to a 3% transaction fee by PayPal. In other words, the actual money's collected by United are 3% less than the actual amount you contribute. If you desire, you may calculate that 3% and add it to your initial contribution in order for United to get your full contribution.



MY NOTES FROM MARCH 22ND SERMON

- ◆ Pray without ceasing and pray about everything: In prayer we acknowledge that God is solemn. Develop a spiritually healthy heart. Thank you God for waking me up; for preparing this meal, etc. Pray for God's anointing on everything we do.
- ♦ Pray for a clean heart and a right spirit
- ◆ Live by the golden rule—"Treat others exactly the way you want to be treated by God and others: Do unto others exactly as you want God to do to you. Always consider the impact of our actions on others.
- ◆ Practice justice tempered with mercy and remain humble: Do not think of yourself better than others. Do the right things for the right reasons. If someone steps out of line give the person a second chance. God gives us multiple chances. Do not think more highly of ourselves
- ♦ Love unconditionally—That love that makes one say I'll be quiet, even though I know that I'm right and don't want to listen. Do not repay evil for evil. Forgive always and quickly. Things in our past does not have to frame or define us. Don't put conditions on people for loving them. This does not mean accepting abuse—it's ok to love from a distance.
- ♦ Forgive always and quickly.

You can do all the right things but if not being done for the right reason, God does not accept it.


