



Goals Chart

Getting Started

This year our class will be keeping track of our accomplishments through a chart on our classroom wall that represents a fast growing stand of bamboo. Did you know that giant bamboo can grow more than 1 yard in a day! Follow these directions to make the pieces for your part of our classroom pride!

Materials:

- 2 2"x6" pieces of green construction paper
- staples OR rubber cement
- 3"x5" scrap construction paper, a color of your choice

Directions:

1. Turn a 2"x6" piece of green construction sideways and cut fringe along one long side to make grass.
2. Bend the grass down a little to give it some depth.
3. Write your name neatly and in big letters with a pencil. Trace over it with a dark marker.
4. Staple (or glue) it on the wall, right next to another name, along the bottom edge of the wall or bulletin board.



Goals Chart

Evaluating your goal.


After you have reached your goal, think about how hard it was to complete. Rate it on a scale of 1-10, 10 would be the most difficult.

Materials:

- 1"x6" pieces of green construction paper: get as many pieces as the difficulty level with which you rated your goal
- paper medallions OR panda cutouts
- staples OR rubber cement

Directions:

1. Fold a 1"x6" piece of green construction in half, long ways.
2. Round off the corners to make an oval leaf. Unfold it.
3. Make a leaf for each point you gave your goal. If it was a level 3 goal (it wasn't very hard to reach), make 3 leaves, etc. If you need a lot of leaves, cut a thin strip of green construction paper and attach the leaves to this "stem." (Here are the leaves for a goal rated the most difficult—10!)



Bamboo

Bamboo is the fastest growing plant on our planet! It has been recorded as growing more than 46 inches in 24 hours! It cleans the air better than any other stand of trees, and can be used to make furniture, flooring, clothing, carpet, hair brushes, concrete, boxes, paper, and food. It reaches full growth in one year, and can be harvested in 3-5 years. It handles extreme weather conditions, too; it was the first plant to grow back after an atomic bomb attack in Hiroshima. Bamboo also prevents soil erosion. It's one of the most useful plants we have.



Key

Each student has set individual goals. The goals and the progress are written on the bamboo stems. When a goal is reached it is reviewed. The bamboo stem is then given leaves, to represent the difficulty of the goal. The more leaves you see, the harder the goal was!

- 1 Leaf: This goal was a cinch to achieve.
- 2 Leaves: This goal was easy to achieve.
- 3 Leaves: This goal was somewhat easy to achieve.
- 4 Leaves: This goal was a little easy to achieve.
- 5 Leaves: This goal was not very hard to achieve.
- 6 Leaves: This goal was just barely difficult to achieve.
- 7 Leaves: This goal was a little difficult to achieve.
- 8 Leaves: This goal was somewhat difficult to achieve.
- 9 Leaves: This goal was difficult to achieve.
- 10 Leaves: This goal was almost impossible to achieve.

The Panda or the Medallion means the goal was achieved at a higher level than we anticipated!
