

Comments on financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2017

Revenue to the church is broken down into three major areas.

Offertory income

The regular offertory has shown a decline from 2016 to 2017 of \$454 or approximately 2%. As cost are usually increasing it is up to each parishioner to assess whether they are able to help the parish keep pace with at least the cost of inflation. The Diocese receives 20% of these amounts to assist them in covering the cost of supporting the local parishes.

Special Collections and Stipend

In addition to general offertory the parish participates in several areas of raising funds for specific purposes. Amounts are donated and the majority of these flow through to the organization for which collections were raised.

Hall Rental

The parish hall is available tor rental by both parishioners and the public. The daily rental fee is \$140 for parishioners and \$200 for the public. In addition, each tenant has to pay for event insurance. If anyone requires meeting facilities consideration should be given to rent from the parish.

Wages and Benefits

The cost of wages and benefits includes the cost of the Parish priest as well as support staff. It should be noted that last year additional payments were necessary when Father Sany underwent surgery.

Occupancy costs

The occupancy cost breaks out the specific cost related to maintaining the church, the rectory and the parish hall. This year we have broken out the amounts related to regular maintenance and those that relate to a capital nature and will have benefits beyond the current year.

Major betterments include the following by year

2017 New flooring in church

Repairs to Rectory porch including pillars and steps Replace furnace in Church Railing to church parking lot Rectory completion of bath room renovation Church lighting <u>2016</u>

Install tile in Parish Hall New furnace in Rectory

Rectory bathroom commencement of renovation

Dehumidifiers in Parish Hall

The breakdown of Electricity and heat and gas are as follows:

The major shift in cost was the heating cost of the Rectory when furnace changed from electric to propane.

Conclusion

The parish is in a positive liquidity position with cash and investments now exceeding \$260,000.

It should be noted that Father Sany's stewardship of the Church assets has been exemplary and shows improvement of the financial wellbeing of the parish
