ADORATION

Adoration is at 9:30 a.m. on the second Wednesday of the month.

LENTEN PRACTICES

Prayer: Consecrate yourself to Jesus every morning. Schedule a set time every day to quiet your heart in order to sense God's love. Use this time to read and reflect on passages of Scripture, do daily meditations, or other spiritual devotions.

Repentance: Take a few minutes every night to look over your day and repent of any sins.

Fasting: Fasting from different kinds of food is a traditional Lenten practice. But there are other areas in which you can practice self-denial. You can fast from anger, moodiness, hatred, discrimination, negative statements, holding onto resentments, or using God's name carelessly. Which of these might you choose to fast from?

Almsgiving: During Lent, focus on blessing someone every day! Here are some ways you can do that: share a snack, give away a hygiene item, show kindness, support and encouragement, say positive and uplifting things, forgive and initiate the healing of a broken relationship, make a phone call or write a letter. Which would you choose to do?
