




TRANSFORMED THROUGH EUCHARIST

What happens during the Eucharist? How important is Eucharist to you? Why are you preparing your child to make their First Communion?

As parents of children preparing to receive First Eucharist in the spring of 2021 at any parish within the English sector, you are asked to attend this session taking place on Thursday, November 19th at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church, Riverview.

COVID-19 physical distancing regulations will be observed and wearing of masks is mandatory. Because of the pandemic, we are unable to provide childcare.

No tea, coffee or snacks will be provided; however, participants are welcome to bring their own.

Registration of children receiving the sacrament will take place from 6:15 – 6:30 p.m. At 6:30 facilitators Karen LeBlanc and Ellen Bennett will offer an overview of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and talk about how, through the Eucharist, the bread and wine *and* the assembly are transformed again into the Body of Christ. Those children who have not been registered by 6:30 will have to be registered following the session.

Please contact Ellen or your parish catechetical coordinator to confirm your attendance. Also note that the session from 6:30 – 8:30 is open to anyone interested in attending, but they are asked to contact Ellen to register.

Participants are asked to arrive no later than 6:00 p.m. to provide time to welcome everyone safely.

<u>THE END IS NIGH: Exploring the Book of Revelations</u> Join Dr. Andrew Wilson and Dr. Fiona Black on Tuesday, November 24th from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in a virtual session, looking at Revelations, the final book of the New Testament.

This book often poses a challenge to interpreters with its colourful and fantastical imagery of the end of days. At the same time, given the bewildering events of the past year alone, it seems more relevant to our current world situation than ever. Andrew and Fiona will look at Revelations as an example of "apocalyptic literature" an ancient mode of storytelling with a rich and evocative history, consider its place within our Christian tradition and explore what it might add to an appreciation of the topsy-turvy times within which we live.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING On October 20th, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops released a statement expressing their opposition to the re-tabling of Bill C-7, an act to amend the Criminal Code around medical assistance in dying re-introduced by the federal government on October 5, 2020. This statement is in addition to the joint ecumenical and interfaith statement released on 14 October 2020 entitled: <u>"We Can and Must do Much Better – Religious Leaders in Canada denounce Bill C-7, 'An Act to amend the Criminal Code (medical assistance in dying)'"</u>.

As the legislation introduced this month remains unchanged from that which was tabled on 24 February 2020, the Bishops of Canada once again express their serious concerns regarding Bill C-7 and call upon all Canadians to express their opposition to the Bill. As said in the statement: "The proposed legislation of Bill C-7 remains deeply flawed, unjust, and morally pernicious. The Bishops of Canada call on Catholics and all people of good will to make their voices heard in opposition to the Bill. Similarly, all Canadian legislators should recall that no law that permits the taking of innocent human life can ever be morally justified. Such a law would always violate the intrinsic dignity of the human person." Exploring our Faith

Let's get ready!

I don't know if anyone else feels this way, but I found that this liturgical calendar has gone by so fast. As we quickly approach the end of this liturgical year, like any good "end of the year", we prepare. Don't we all set out at the end of the year, setting out goals and challenges for ourselves? Well, that's exactly what we're being asked in this weeks' gospel reading; to be prepared and to get ready. But be prepared and get ready for what? Jesus' uses a parable, as he often did, to instruct the disciples on the need for watchfulness, since they do not know the time of the return of the Son of Man.



I don't know if you have read the parable so here is a quick synopsis: it pictures ten maidens who go to meet the bridegroom. Five, described as "wise", have prepared by bringing along flasks of oil for their lamps; five are described as "foolish" because they have not prepared for a time of waiting by bringing along extra oil. When their oil runs out and the wedding banquet finally begins, the foolish maidens are off buying more oil. Whilst they are gone buying more oil, those who came prepared were granted access into the weeding banquet, and when the foolish return they are not granted access to the banquet. I think that the point of the parable has a simple question implied. What are we actually doing while we are

waiting for Jesus? In our every day lives, we all know how to get ready, because we do it all the time. We get ready for appointments, we get ready for work, for school and for those of us who have kids, we get ready for their arrival. The gospel asks us to get ready and be prepared on a much deeper level. But what does this mean and what does this look like? To quote the late John Thornhill: "the parable invites us to ask ourselves whether we are ready to meet our Lord, and to review the loyalties and values that shape our lives, we may well ponder what is offered to us by God's Word in the first reading: the joy and peace that come from being in tune with God is there to be 'found by those who look'." Are we sitting around with no thought or concern for ourselves and others, or are we actively living our daily lives with meaning and purpose?

I think that being prepared and ready for Jesus is seen in how we live our daily lives, right here and now. It's seen in our actions, in how we speak to and of others, in how we treat others. It's how we try to live our daily life as followers of Jesus. It's not about sitting around and waiting for something to happen, as being prepared is never a passive thing. We must be like boy scouts and always be prepared! To be well prepared, with extra flasks of oil, is to live a life that is worthy of the calling given to each of us by God. So let's do it! Let's strive to be intentional in our preparedness and readiness with all our hearts and minds. *Katy Mahoney*
