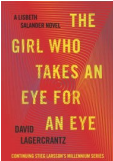

This year's theme was Build a Better World – an idea cemented with an opening magic show by Barry the Builder and Sam the Tool Time Turtle that entertained young and old alike. From then on for the next two months, each week was filled to the brim with exciting, curated activities for children from birth to middle school. These special events showed us all how to better ourselves and our community, from Rob Lindelof of PAC Fitness teaching us how to build our bodies, Savannah Jenkins guiding the way to a stronger self-esteem, to David Crane and Julie Philips displaying the importance of a clean environment through our annual Summer Reading favorite stream walk. Even the smallest of library goers began constructing a lifelong love of reading with story time fun such as creating a town out of envelopes and crafting a robot out of recyclables. Of course, the participants who logged their reading this summer really blew the roof off, with the children of Giles County having read an astonishing 3,000 plus books. Additionally, the library held the School Pride competition for a third year in a row, recording how many books students of each Giles County school read. The staff counted all titles at the end of the summer and announced the winner: Southside Elementary School. In a grand show of school spirit, the Supercats finished the hottest part of the year with a total 853 books under their belts. Way to go, Southside!
