


From The Board:

Backyard chicken coops are the newest home and health improvement promotion in magazines and other publications. The coops are promoted as a benefit to provide organic eggs, compost and other health benefits to the family and yard.

The other day on Facebook this was posted "It is a sad day in our house hold. The City of Sugar Land came down on us and gave us 48 hours to get rid of our home raised laying hens. We have raised chickens for 6 years in Houston and Sugar Land. My boys cared for the hens and sold the eggs to friends for extra money to pay for the feed."

We would like to remind you that not only are chickens not permitted under Sugar Mill Deed Restrictions, but they are also not permitted anywhere in Sugar Land.





The Board has also received a couple of calls about coyotes in the neighborhood. We want to admonish everyone to be careful and to not leave their pets outside unattended. Coyotes run along Oyster Creek and have become rather urbanized, so trapping and capture is economically ineffective. A loud clap will usually scare a coyote away and unless you are between a momma and her pups, the coyote is more afraid of you. Just treat these roaming animals with respect.

The construction across the street has disturbed their habitat and they will leave the area when there is no longer food around. The coyotes usually hunt between sundown and sunrise, so please keep your eyes open and your pets on a leash while out walking.

The kids are out of school so that means there is more bicycle traffic and more visitors to our neighborhoods. Please make sure that vehicles are parked safely and they do not block the sidewalks.

Marion's Fishing Corner

Summer patterns

The water temperatures on Misty Lake are hovering around 82 to 85 degrees. This means that the bass are locked in to their summertime patterns. Their normal routine now is short flurries of feeding activity early in the morning and again late in the evening. During the bright sunlight and heat of the day, the larger fish are usually content to sulk out in deeper water in whatever structure they can find. These fish can sometimes still be caught, but bait presentations usually need to be slow and methodical. The exceptions to this, of course, are the small bass. They remain more active in bright, hot conditions and can normally be caught with more regularity.

Other species of fish are not as sensitive to super-warm water conditions. Bluegill and catfish are very active this time of year. Blue and Channel catfish are just now wrapping up their spawning activities that occur in late spring and early summer. They can be found along any of the bulkheads and will readily eat shrimp, prepared "stink baits", or even hot dogs that are suspended under a bobber. This is a great time to re-introduce our youngsters to the pleasures of fishing. With school out for

the summer and air temperatures not as brutal as they will be later, the opportunity for success is at hand. These fish are eager to tug on their line. Bluegill and other sunfish are always easy to find and catch this time of year. Just pick up a



carton of live mealy worms at the local sporting goods store, hook one on a small aberdeen-style hook under a bobber, and you are in business.

So I hope you all have a safe and enjoyable summer. Our lake is in great shape and I hope that we all share the resolve to preserve it and enjoy it for years to come.

Remember to catch and release, because a bass is too valuable of a resource to catch just once....

Service Days for Bulky Trash Collection to Change

Service days for bulky waste pickup will change for all residents on Aug. 4. Bulky waste service is provided once a month for items too large to fit in the garbage cart. Bulky waste does not include construction, demolition or hazardous wastes. Some residents will also have a new day for recycling, but collection days for garbage and green waste will not change. The changes are detailed online at the City's website: www.sugarlandtx.gov/solidwaste, and residents will receive information by mail that includes a magnet detailing the new service schedules. Automated recycling service is provided once a week utilizing a City-issued green cart with a wide range of materials being accepted, including:

- •all colors of glass bottles and jars;
- •newspapers, magazines, catalogs, phonebooks, office paper, school paper, mail, paper-back books:
- cardboard, paperboard and paper bags;
- •steel and tin cans (labels are ok);
- •aluminum cans, foil, and food trays; and
- •plastics #1-5, 7.

Green waste collection is also provided weekly. The green waste program ensures all green waste -- grass clippings, leaves, brush, tree limbs, etc. -- will be recycled rather than sent to a landfill. Green waste materials should be placed in a reusable container or tied bags; compostable bags are not required.





MOW TIME

Don't let the grass grow under your feet this season. For a healthy looking yard, now's the time to get started. Take a page from HGTV's lawn care handbook with these tips.

First, clear the weeds and roots and rototill 6 inches below ground. This will help prepare the area to include equal parts loam, sand and topsoil. During this time, create a slight slope to help with drainage.

If sod is not in your budget, the next step is to hand-seed or hydroseed (a technique that spreads the seeds evenly). Choose the grass seed that is right for your climate and how you will use the lawn.

When it's time to cut the grass, set the mower to the highest notch that only mows the top third. This helps with root development and prevents the ground from drying out too quickly.

Then, get out the hose. If you just seeded, water every day for five to 10 minutes. After new grass comes up, water once a day for 15 to 20 minutes. Consider your soil type to figure out how much.

Twice a year, in spring and fall, fertilize.


