

WALTER G. WINEMAN 1911 - 1997

Walter G. Wineman, 86, founder and retired owner of Acme Roll Forming Company in Sebawaing, died Sunday evening, Dec. 14, at Bay Medical Center, Bay City, from injuries received in an auto accident near Sebawaing on Dec. 1.

Mr. Wineman was born Feb. 1, 1911, in Detroit, the son of Walter H. and Julia (Graves) Wineman.

He was married to Martha E. Moll in Bay City on Oct. 28, 1939.

Mr. Wineman had been a metal fabricator and manufacturer for many years. He started Walt's Welding Shop in Sebawaing in 1939, and did work for Baker

Perkins of Saginaw and Defoe Ship Builders of Bay City. He also developed three patents regarding material handling racks. The company changed to Acme Roll Forming in 1960, which he managed until his retirement in 1985.

He was a life member of the National Rifle Association and a member of Caseville Rod and Gun Club.

Surviving are his wife, Martha E. Wineman of Sebawaing, four sons and one daughter and spouses, Dr. Bruce A. Wineman, DO, and Catherine of Spencer, WI, Charles and Pam Wineman, James Wineman and Sally, and David Wineman, all of Sebawaing, Margo and Paul Badoni, Oak Forest, IL, 15 grandchildren, two sisters and their husbands, Florence and Walter Jarvis of Esseville and May and Harold Andrews of White Lake, one brother, Ralph Wineman of Detroit, and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by two sisters, Clara Wolf and Alice Rosborough.

The funeral service will take place at 11 a.m. Thursday, Dec. 18, in Dinkel-Juengel Funeral Home, Sebawaing. Rev. Albert Bahr will officiate.
