#### A Word for 2021...

—If you picked one word, one idea to focus on this year, what would it be?

It seems to be one of the newer fads or, perhaps, strategies for goal setting these days. You find a word that sums up where you want to go, what you want to accomplish, who you want to be in the year to come. You keep that word in your mind, in front of your eyes all year. You let it shape your choices, your priorities, your attitudes.

It's a simple approach, and probably a lot more effective than creating a list of "New Year's Resolutions" that we don't remember and that never shape our lives.

When talk about receiving "a word from God," we're usually not talking about a single word. But that's exactly what some Christians do with this new approach—they ask God "what's the word, the concept, the quality You want me to focus on this year, Lord?"

There are a number of churches that do this, too. The leaders ask God to give them a word that will focus the whole church on the direction, the area of growth, the mission challenge they want to tackle.

So, what would be <u>our</u> "word from God?" With people still hurting from the upheaval, the financial strains of COVID shutdowns, with neighbors still fearful of what's ahead, with children still wondering when school will be back to normal, with the political animosity of 2020 still seething, and with the confusion and lostness of our world growing visibly...

...what word might God give us to keep us focused on the opportunities, the needs, His priorities for the year to come?

I'm still working on this, but as I think about the disillusionment, the shattered dreams, the struggles people have endured, the way our "systems" have failed us... it seems clear that people need a radical new beginning. And maybe the approaches we take as a church also need a radically new life.

So what if our word for 2021 was **RESURRECTION**? That's certainly biblical enough isn't it? When Jesus called us to take up the cross and follow Him, he was inviting us to die to self so that we could live for him. When we look at the spiritually dead lives around us, do we see people who just need a fresh coat of paint, or do we see people who need a resurrection? ...people who need to leave that old life in the dust, and begin a whole new life empowered by God, filled with His love and presence!





#### Our Response to the COVID Crisis

Churches have responded in a wide variety of ways to the COVID virus, and I thought it would be helpful for our church family to understand what we have done and are doing in response to this virus.

Initial Response: Our first response, when the Corona Virus threat was first described, was to shut down our in-person activities completely. At that point, we knew very little about what the health effects of the virus were, who was most vulnerable, whether our hospitals could handle the number of people who might need medical care, and what personal efforts did and did not help. The health officials told us that we needed to "flatten the curve"—which means they expected people would get the virus, but they wanted to slow how quickly it spread.

Initially, we moved all of our worship and Bible study activities to online, phone, and mail. We "beefed up" our broadcast equipment and capabilities... which was hard because the electronics needed were hard to find when the demand skyrocketed.

Improved Treatment: As time went on, the medical community learned who was most vulnerable to COVID, and to whom it posed almost no risk at all. They fine-tuned their responses, learning what treatments were most effective to restore people's health. And we got to the place that the virus survival rate was, according to the CDC, 99.9+% for people 70 years old or less.

Consequences of the Shutdowns: We've also been paying attention to the serious secondary consequences of various responses to the virus. We have seen suicides increase dramatically because of the mental health impact of isolating people. Drug overdose deaths have risen dramatically, too.

We have seen the huge negative effects on so many children's education and well-being from the shutdown of schools. In our area, huge numbers of children are receiving <u>no</u> education because they are home alone as parents work, and have no internet access. Of course, allowing children to have unsupervised internet access all day isn't a good thing, either.

So many small business owners have had to close down their family's source of income due to restrictions, or seen their income painfully reduced. Layoffs have left many family's with no health coverage. And many people have had other medical tests and procedures postponed as we focused COVID, with serious health consequences for them.

Our Church's Precautions: With thanks to our Properties Committee, we have installed air purifiers in our Fellowship hall HVAC system. Sammy Marshburn has sprayed our buildings' surfaces with an anti-viral treatment repeatedly. And we have kept a supply of hand sanitizer and face masks available (in addition to the many hand-washing stations in our restrooms). So, as our understanding of COVID has increased, and the dangers decreased, we have eased back into normal activities.

Honoring Your Choice: We know that many of our folks are choosing to self-isolate, and we support that choice completely. But many of our folks have chosen to be out and active, knowing the reduced threat the virus poses, so we have also returned to a normal schedule of activities for those participants. And we are still working on improving the reliability and quality of our broadcasting, so that those who are home can still be a part of what's going on at First Baptist Church.

We have had some of our members test positive for the virus, and the symptoms have been as mild as a temporary loss of taste to flu-like symptoms and respiratory congestion. But there is no evidence that they contracted it at church, and they have all recovered completely.

In summary, we have done our best to respond according to the facts and data, and not according to mere fear and hysteria. The news media gets their viewers by keeping people scared to death, but a careful study of the facts and numbers show that COVID, while serious, is not as dangerous as first thought, especially when someone has no other serious health issues. And a fearful over-reaction can also be harmful to people's mental and physical health.

Mainly, we have also chosen to treat our members like thoughtful, intelligent adults who can decide for themselves whether to engage or pull back, depending on their own comfort level and risk category. And we have tried to stay connected, no matter what choice people have made.

We chose the "middle road" of cautious re-engagement. Other churches and church leaders have taken different approaches, and I respect their reasoning and their choice. This has been a time when every choice we make has risk and it seems like there is no clear "right choice." There has certainly been no choice that everyone can agree on!

But we, as your church staff, are extremely thankful for the understanding and support of our church family as we navigate these days together!

We're praying for you and for a much calmer and safer 2021. Happy New Year!!
