# Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

26<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Year B

Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

"I Paul, planted, Apollos watered, but God caused the growth. Therefore, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, causes the growth." (1 Corinthians 3:6-7) Based on today's gospel reading, St Paul understands what St John has not learned yet. But John is about to. John and the apostles were getting jealously competitive to the point of sabotaging someone else's ministry in Christ's name! Obviously, even the apostles can be tempted to envy. Notice John's statement (maybe even boast?) to Jesus about stopping good work, only because the worker wasn't pre-approved by John. He says, "We saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow <u>us</u>" (9:38) So, John presumes that since someone didn't ask him personally for permission to minster, then John felt justified to stop/prevent that man from serving a sick person. Isn't that backward, the opposite of what we expect? I wonder what the sick person thought about that?

Why stop good work in Jesus' Name? Because you are not the one getting praise for it? That seems to be John's reason by his own words. And maybe surprising to us, this sabotage happens all the time in Christ's ministry. Yes, good ministry is subverted, sidelined and even stopped due to the jealousy & envy among Christ's self-appointed disciples. We even see that Jesus' first followers were not above working against each other because of their sinful pride. John felt self-important and usurped the role of Jesus in determining who could and could not serve Him. And who suffers most from these power games, but the sick and needy who cry for Jesus' help. Of course, we're aware of other times when the apostles fought amongst themselves with different powerplays, such as when James and John (yes this same John) who tried to push away the others to presumptuously claim the seats of glory beside Jesus' right and left, infuriating the other ten (Mark 10:37). St Paul even tells of being 'persecuted' himself by official representatives of Christ that Paul refers to as acting like 'super-apostles' (2 Cor 11:5, 12:11) He diagnoses the 'persecution' to be the result of 'rivalry, envy, jealousy, gossip' (2Cor 12:20). Of course, such division among Christ' followers breaks Jesus' heart (& breaks the Body of Christ too). This accounts for why Jesus is so strong about condemning such scandalous division/hurt. In Mark 9:42, Jesus says, "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." Jesus is pointing out how dangerous 'bad example' can be when Christians work against each other (such poor behavior among Christians is what gives people excuse to ignore Christians, saying, "If those Christians act that way toward one another, forget me ever becoming one of them-I don't need Christianity to learn how to fight!" Jesus calls us to work peacefully together, to seek unity and always give the benefit of doubt in supporting any good mission in His Name. If it is good, then step out of the Way! Never impede a good work done in His Name. (It may not be mine, but I am not important, only the glory of Jesus!) We serve Him, not ourselves!

Another way of avoiding this scandal, is to adopt the attitude 'Live and let live!' when it comes to ministry in Jesus' Name. Jesus seems to express this sentiment, too, once when a Jewish Samaritan town rejected the apostles and they wished to vengefully 'call lighting down upon it'(Lk 9:55 -yes, the same John again and his brother James). Jesus commands them to 'Let it be- just move one'. He basically tells them, "Don't waste time with controversy, there is too much good to be done!" We should lament about how much time we spend gossiping about or slandering other people's good work instead of just minding our own ministry itself. I suspect such 'meddling' is what Jesus was calling Peter to avoid when he was being nosey about another apostle, in John 21:22 "What if I want him to remain until I come? What concern it is of yours? You follow me." Jesus wishes for us to mind our own good work and not interfere with the good ministry of others. (Maybe this is behind His quote 'let not the right hand know what the left hand is doing' -Matt 6:3) I hear Him telling us, "If you are not directly involved or can't have a positive influence in collaborating and bettering the good work, then let it be and focus only on what you can effect for good!" 
