Program: Through her presentation 'Captivating Color in our Quilts', Wendy Butler Berns showed us how using the color wheel to choose colors and hues can add visual interest to quilts. She had a variety of traditional and contemporary art quilts that demonstrated the concepts of complimentary, analogous, and triad colors.

Business:

- Ginger Wanserski announced July's meeting will be the annual picnic. Note that it starts at 6pm! 


