

Mrs. William Dormey Dies Unexpectedly In Sand Point Home

Mrs. Eva Dormey, 54, wife of William Dormey, longtime operators of Blue Water Inn, Caseville, died Sunday night at her home on Sand Point following a heart attack. Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. Thursday in Shetler Funeral Home, Pigeon, with Elder Floyd Horton officiating. Burial will be in Caseville Cemetery.

Mrs. Dormey was born Eva McDermid in Port Austin Township on March 1, 1907, and was married to Mr. Dormey in Cleveland on December 29, 1925. After operating a restaurant in Bad Axe from 1925 to 1932, they moved to Caseville and began operation of the Blue Water Inn. Mrs. Dormey was a member of Caseville Chapter, Order of Eastern Star.
