



<sup>1</sup>For this reason I, Paul, a prisoner for Christ Jesus on behalf of you Gentiles—  
<sup>2</sup>assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God’s grace that was given to me for  
 you, <sup>3</sup>how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly.  
<sup>4</sup>When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, <sup>5</sup>which was
