A Holiday Message by Rabbi Joseph Lichtman z"l From 2001

Every year, it is told, just before *Yom Kippur*, the Belzer Rebbe would ascend the *Bima* and call out in a loud voice, *Shlosha d'varim tzarich adam lomar b'soch beiso erev Shabbos im chasheicha: Isartem, Airavtem, Hadliku es haneir?*. "A man is obligated to say three things in his house before Shabbos at dusk, 'Did you separate the tithe, Did you arrange the *eiruv* and did you kindle the Shabbos lights?'"

The Rebbe interpreted *erev Shabbos im chasheicha* as *Erev Yom Kippur* just before *Kol Nidre* when there is no more time left to do *t'shuvah* and he must remind his household of three things: 1) *Isartem* - The *Aseres y'may t'shuvah* have passed, 2) *Airavtem* - It is already *Erev Yom Kippur*? 3) *Hadliku es haneir* - The *Yom Kippur* candles are already lit. So he shouted, "When do you expect to repent? If not now then when?"

As we stand at the threshold of the New Year, we too have an obligation to take stock and realize that the days are fleeing by. We have to ask ourselves, will there be enough time to do *T'shuvah*? For don't we all want to stand before the Throne of Justice as innocent lambs free of any taint of sin? So we *daven* with more *kavana*, beat our breasts and ask for forgiveness from Alm-ghty G-d.

We read in the Torah on Rosh Hashana the episode of Hagar and Yishmael. When the Angel appears and says to Hagar, *Al tira, ki shama Elokim es kol hanaar ba'asher hu sham.* - "Fear not, for Hashem has heard the voice of the lad as he is now." Although Yishmael was destined to become wicked later in life, G-d does not judge him by later standards of behavior, but as he is *now*.

We too, as G-d surely knows, will return to our "old ways" at the end of *Aseres y'mai t'suvah*, But we implore Him not to judge us as we will become later, but rather, *as we are now*. For now we appear as supplicants, petitioners, dressed in *Talis* and *Kittle*, looking like angels and free from sin. Judge us we pray, *as we are now*.

May I wish all our *mispalilim* that the year 5762 be a year of peace, health and prosperity, for us and *Klal Yisroel* in *Eretz Yisroel*.

A Selichos Thought by the late Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks zt"l

Why do *Selichot* always start on a Saturday night? In *Ashkenazi* circles we will soon be commencing our season of *Selichot*.

Until medieval times, *Selichot* were recited just before *Rosh Hashana* and *Yom Kippur*. From that time onwards in *Sefardi* circles, *Selichot* would commence from the beginning of *Elul* and go all the way through until *Yom Kippur*. In the *Ashkenazi* world we follow the opinion of the *Rama* in the *Shulchan Aruch* that we start *Selichot* at least four days before *Rosh Hashana* and we go all the way through until *Yom Kippur*. In addition, the *Selichot* must start on a Saturday night, that's in order to standardise the practice, so that people will always know that *Selichot* start on *Motzei Shabbat*, every year.

It starts on Saturday night, but why Saturday night – it could start on any night? The *Terumat Hadeshen* explains that we want to take the *Oneg Shabbat*, the pleasure and the joy of the *Shabbat* with us into our *Selichot* penitential prayer experience. That's because during *Selichot* we reflect on the previous year, our misdeeds, our misdemeanors, our missed opportunities. We could easily be filled with fear and dread at this prospect, yet seeing as we are a positively minded people and we are always optimistic by nature it's important that we take the happiness of *Shabbat* with us into the *Selichot* experience.

And that is why they are called *Selichot* which means 'forgiveness'. Before the services even commence we are looking forward to a favourable outcome. When you come to think of it that's the rationale behind the title *Yom Kippur*: it's on *Yom Kippur* that God sits in judgement, our fate will be sealed for the coming year and, in the midst
