THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Integrity of the Person

The chaste person maintains the integrity of the powers of life and love placed in him. This integrity ensures the unity of the person; it is opposed to any behavior that would impair it. It tolerates neither a double life nor duplicity in speech.

Chastity includes an *apprenticeship in self-mastery* which is a training in human freedom. The alternative is clear: Either man governs his passions and finds peace, or he lets himself be dominated by them and becomes unhappy. "Man's dignity therefore requires him to act out of conscious and free choice as moved and drawn in a personal way from within, and not by blind impulses in himself or by mere external constraint. Man gains such dignity when, ridding himself of all slavery to the passions, he presses forward to his goal by freely choosing what is good and, by his diligence and skill, effectively secures for himself the means suited to this end."

SMALL WAYS TO MAKE HOLY WEEK MORE MEANINGFUL

As we approach the solemnity of Holy Week--beginning next Sunday-the following are some small ways you might think about now to make this special time a richer and more meaningful experience.

- 1. **TAKE A SMALL PRAYER BREAK** (three minutes counts!) during the day.
- 2. **THINK** of a small thing that you could do for someone else to lighten their day? (Veronica wiped the face of Jesus...)
- 3. **VISIT OR CALL** one friend who may need cheering up. (The ladies tried to console Christ on the way to Calvary even though it was only temporary).
- 4. **GO** to confession with joy and thanksgiving in experiencing the mercy of Christ. (30 minutes prior to each Mass--the door is always open...stop by!)
- 5. **SET ASIDE** a few minutes to read a Passion chapter in the Gospels--human cruelty meets divine mercy.
- 6. Make it a point to **FORGIVE** someone on Good Friday and remember others who are far from God's mercy.
- 7. **PRAY** a decade of the Sorrowful Mysteries in consolation of the sorrows of our Blessed Mother at this time when her heart must be so very heavy.
- 8. **CHEERFULLY OFFER UP** difficulties you experience for those who suffer without the grace of knowing Jesus.
- 9. **STOP BY** church on Good Friday afternoon for a visit.
- **10. PLAN AN EASTER CELEBRATION.** Holy Week is our a solemn time to reflect upon the sufferings of Christ for our redemption. Easter is however within sight now and sadness will become joy. How can you share this joy with others?
