

Stewardship

When I was a child, I often thought of the Church as something mystical and supernatural. Jesus became a man so that supernatural element could break into the natural world in a profound way. It is one of the aspects of Catholicism that I have grown to appreciate the most as I have matured: for a Catholic, the supernatural is natural. The communion of saints is heavenly and earthly at the same time.

The Beatitudes instruct us about this reality. Pope Francis reminds us that holiness is "not about swooning in mystic rapture." Holiness is about living in the real world and doing extraordinary things with our ordinary lives. Our stewardship way of life consists of actions in the natural world that have extraordinary repercussions.

Do not ever take your simple actions of generosity and love for granted. As disciples called to a life of stewardship, we participate in something more profound than what we can see. We bring blessing to all those with whom we choose to share ourselves.


Middle & High School Youth Group

SERVICE IN OUR PARISH

Music Ministry

Many of us have been singing at Mass our whole lives, but have we ever really asked why? This week we will look at what the Catechism says about music at Mass. There are 3 primary roles of music in the Mass. 1) To add beauty to expressive prayer. Music adds a beauty and fervor to our prayer and praise that is different from simple spoken word. 2) To help the unanimous participation of the assembly. So the point of the music at Mass is not to listen and be entertained, but to sing and lift our hearts together to the praise of God! 3) To add to the solemnity of the celebration of the liturgy or the season. For example, our music during the Lenten season of fasting and repentance should be guite different then our music during the joyful feast of Easter Sunday. Finally, the primary role of all music at Mass or anywhere else in the Church is "the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful." So no matter how good or bad you think your voice is, sing out and add your voice to the voices of all the saints and angels of heaven.

"When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you? And the king will reply, Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." <u>Diocesan Bulletin Bite:</u> "And raising his eyes toward his disciples, he said: Blessed . . . "

Imagine that people from Jerusalem, other parts of Judea and from towns near the Mediterranean Sea are gathered on the slopes of the hills rising out of the northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee. They heard about Jesus and came to listen to him. Imagine there was a stenographer sitting next to Jesus writing down everything he said. Well, there were people gathered on the hillside, but there was no one writing down everything Jesus said. The people on the hillside and in other places, on other occasions, heard the same thing and more from Jesus. They came to hear him because they had also heard that his life matched his message. He did not teach others to do what he was not doing himself. That made him different from the High Priest, Sadducees, Pharisees, and scribes. There were no newspapers, radio, television, videos or social media to spread the teaching of Jesus. People went home and shared what they heard with their family and village. When we imitate Jesus, people may ask why we do that. Then we can tell them about Jesus.
