DINNER

The National Commission on the Status of Women was established in 1951 to study the status of women in the United States and to recommend ways to improve it. The Commission was created by Executive Order 10311, signed by President Truman on July 1, 1951.

The Commission was headed by Eleanor Roosevelt, the former First Lady. It was composed of 11 members, including women from various fields of work and life. The Commission's first report, "The Status of Women in the United States," was published in 1951.

The Commission's report was a landmark document that identified many of the problems facing women in the United States, such as discrimination in the workplace, unequal pay, and limited opportunities for advancement. It also recommended many reforms to address these issues, including the passage of laws to protect women's rights in the workplace and to ensure equal pay for equal work.
