

We have raffles every meeting. If you have a painted piece that you think would be popular as a raffle item, contact the **Ways & Means Chairman: Jeanne Delbusso**

If there is a newspaper or free flyer in your area that you know will publish GTDP's classes, Retreat or Basket Luncheon, contact the **Publicity Chairman**: **Mary Ann Yurus**

Know of a special class somewhere that might interest our group or know of someone who received an award or something special related to the Decorative Arts, contact the **Newsletter Editor**: **Rosemary Habers.**

Need to know what to bring for our Meeting Lunches. Check the Newsletter or contact the **Hospitality Chair: Cindie Martincic.**

Everything you do for the Chapter earns you points. Everything from attending meetings and classes to donating food and painted items to Ways and Means earns you points. If there is something about Points you don't understand, contact the **Points System Chairman: Rosann Wagner.** Remember at the end of the year to fill out the Application in the back of the Newsletter or Membership book and mail them to her by December 31.

BRUSH NOTES

I received several good comments on last month's article on Brushes so this month I'm writing on how to care for those brushes. Again, I stress I am not an authority. These are things I have learned over the years and have worked for me.

The most important thing about your brushes is the care you give them. Most people do not think of all the things they put their brushes through. It is of the utmost importance that you keep your brushes clean. I see people after a class swish their brushes in their water basin and then put them away. Ouch! First off, you have just used the same water that you put paint into. Would you wash your hair in that? Think of these brushes as hair. Many of them are natural hair or a combination of hair and synthetic. You can't get residue out of hair with just water and dirty water at that, you need soap. There are many different brands of soap on the market made specifically for brushes. Find your favorite. Mine happens to be BJ's. Some people love Murphy's Oil soap or Awsom. Some even use baby oil to clean out the paint then wash with soap. This is a fantastic substitute for the carcinogenic cleaners such as turpentine and even odor free terpenoid when cleaning your oil brushes. I have been told some use hand sanitizer.

Try not to put your brushes away wet. I realize this is hard after a seminar. Wet or dry, never store your brushes on their hair tips, you will damage the ends. If you do this you will find the bristles are curled and no longer lay flat. After cleaning lay the brush flat or suspend it upside down until it dries. I like to hang mine upside down by their handles and have designed a holder for this purpose. I feel this protects the ferrule by not allowing water to run back and into it. Also by being suspended I don't have to worry about the brush standing up on its hairs **Do not** try to rush drying your brushes by using a hair dryer on them. You will give your brush the look of a "bad hair day". The hairs cannot handle the heat and will curl and fan apart. I have, however, broken this rule with large natural hair mop brushes.

Another thing people don't pay attention to is wiping their brush. Most people scrub the brush back and forth on a paper towel. Again, not good. Think of what a paper towel is made from. Don't just say paper. While it is paper, paper is made from wood. So is sandpaper. You will get about the same results with either. The only difference is that sandpaper is quicker. Have you ever noticed that your brush ends are curled and/or uneven? This could be from the abrasion and heat caused by the scrubbing on the paper towel. Always put your brush on the paper towel and squeeze. Not squeeze and pull, squeeze. Also, do not squeeze and bend the bristles back and forth. You risk breaking the hairs this way. "Folding" the bristles against the ferrule will cut and snap off hairs. After I have cleaned my brushes and I am sure there is no longer any paint in them I like to re-lather the brush in BJ's and leave it on. This sizes the brush and helps to protect it. I have also used ivory soap and I have gently run the brush over the gummed part of an envelope in a pinch. It doesn't matter whether you are using oil, acrylic or watercolors. All brushes need to be thoroughly cleaned and all can be cleaned with the same "soaps". Brushes are expensive. Treat them with respect.

We have always said unless you pay for your class prior to the day of class you will not be officially enrolled. That means if the Teacher only prepares enough surfaces for the paid members you might not be able to take the class. Also, in the past we would put reminders in the newsletter to the people who signed up but didn't pay yet (perfect for people like me who can't remember breakfast much less did I pay for a class over a month ago).
