I am grateful for their continuing commitment to provide a meaningful yet safe environment for worship as well as to our secretary Linda Angstadt who went from producing one mailing a month to one a week!

The stay-at-home orders demanded us to rethink how we do church together. I admit at times the learning curves were mind boggling as we recreated ministry to fit pandemic times, but I'm grateful to everyone who went along with this wild ride.

The pandemic did present new opportunities to reach those in need. Josh Mairose asked if we could sew masks for JeffHOPE. (See his article elsewhere in this newsletter.) Thank you to our sewers who not only made masks for JeffHOPE but also for Lutheran World Relief. Our talented ladies include Barbara Weller, Beverly Trumbo, Diannah Swiger, an anonymous friend of the congregation, along with myself. We sewed close to 500 masks! The Spirit does move in wonderful ways!!

From a drive-by Easter Egg Hunt for our children to Zoom meetings for our Church Council and committees, we have discovered new ways of doing ministry together. We continue to support the Schuylkill Haven Food Pantry as well as the Pottsville Soup Kitchen. The local annual Ingathering of LWR quilts and parish kits went off without a hitch. We sent 72 quilts, 93 personal care kits, 180 school bags, and 9 baby kits. Thank you to everyone who supported this ministry!

Our virtual VBS is another reimaged ministry of providing faith formation for our families. With at home lesson packets provided, a zoom meeting with the children at "North Castle," and other links to videos, we continue to engage our children to learn about God's great love for us.

Through these last few months, there are 2 things of which I have been absolutely reassured. 1. God's love, grace, and mercy is always with us, even in times of pandemic! 2. We are church together, no matter what! Thanks for your part of being church together!!

A Brief Look At Some Summer Hill History By Harry Schwenk

This month we will recognize the sixth Revolutionary War Veteran, who is buried in the Summer Hill Cemetery.

Michael married Maria Barbara Schmidt, the daughter of Hans Joerg and Brigita Schmidt. Maria Barbara was born on October 9, 1719 in Hohenstadt, Stuttgart, Baden-Wurttemburg, Germarny. In their married years, Michael and Maria Barbara lived in Windsor Township, Berks County, where they raised their ten children. They are both buried at Zion's Church Cemetery, near the village of Windsor Johannes Dewald was born in Berks County on April 22, 1746. He was the son of Michael and Maria Barbara (Schmidt) Dewald. Michael was born on August 22, 1716 in Rheinland Pfalz, Germany. He arrived at the Port of Philadelphia on September 9, 1738 on the ship "Glasgow." Michael's parents, Abraham and Anna Catharina Dewald came to America in 1736, two years before Michael. In 1740, Castle, southeast of Hamburg.

Richmond Township, Berks County. Her sponsor was Tobias Wagner. Catharina was a sister of Johannes Reber, another Revolutionary War Veteran who is buried at Summer Hill. About the year 1770, Johannes married Catharina Reber, the daughter of Leonhardt and Anna Margaret (Klein) Reber. She was born on March 15, 1751 in Windsor Township, Berks County and was baptized on March 25, 1752 at Zion Moselem Lutheran Church at Moselem, Johannes Dewald, the subject of this article, was the third child and oldest son born to Michael and Maria Barbara.

he is listed as a Private in Captain Reiff's Co. 3rd Battalion, 6th Co., 4th Class. Soon after this time, Johannes decided to see what was on the other side of the Blue Mountains (they could see the Summer Hill, where Johannes first appeared in 1780 on the tax list. Johannes Dewald's name appears on the March 7, 1782 list of the people who met at Nicholas Staller's farm to organize our church. Johannes Dewald served in the Revolutionary War with the Berks County, PA Militia. In 1777, mountains from their home in Windsor Township.) The Dewald Family settled in the area near

under 16, and six females (including his wife.) He owned 240 acres of land and had three cows. Johannes Dewald was both a carpenter and a farmer. The original church had fallen out of repair and action was taken in 1804 to rebuild the church. The building masters were Heinrich Meyer and In the 1790 Census, Johannes is listed as having a family of three boys over 16, three boys Johannes Dewald. The cost of the building was 142 pounds, 8 shillings, and 1 pence. At the dedication services on November 28, 1804, an offering of 25 pounds was received.
