Bil Papp, President Tom McCormack, Vice President Tom Boyle, Treasurer Terry Murphy, Secretary There has been a lot written lately about the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB). These nasty critters are alive and well and living in St. Charles. In Kingswood, we have a good number of Ash trees many of which are planted in the parkways n front of our homes. There are treatments available that some studies have shown are effective in preventing EAB infestation. These are applied by arborists or those working under their direction. A proposal I received last fall was approximately \$55.00 per tree per treatment, and are available from companies such as The Care of Trees in West Chicago, Kramer Tree Service, and others.

It is important to understand that this treatment may need to be continued for a number of years. Keep in mind, too that the parkway trees are the property of the City.

According to Ben Deutsch, the City's arborist, home owners may have EAB treatments applied to their parkway trees, at their expense, but only with the advance knowledge and consent of the City.

The city recently sent notification to homeowners whose parkways have Ash trees that have become infected by the EABs. Fortunately, Kingswood is not one of the neighborhoods receiving the notice.

Quoting the letter, "In those cases where the trees decline to a point where they become unsafe or beyond treatment, the City will remove them...The ash trees will be replaced in the following spring or fall planting season with a different species. Planting will be



dependent on budget concerns, the severity of the infestation, and the number of trees removed during the prior year". The City will pay for replacement trees "with trees that are 2.5" in diameter and about 10' to 12' tall. Upgrades in size are available at \$100.00 for every 1/2" in diameter."
