
### Cal-Nev-Ari Sells for \$8 Million

Nancy Kidwell, who owned most of the real estate and the largest businesses in town and co-founded it with her late husband, had been trying to sell Cal-Nev-Ari for years. The Review-Journal recently reported that a mining company, Universal Green Technology, bought 550 acres, including the whole town and surrounding desert, for \$8 million in a deal that closed a month ago. ### Canada Gets Single-Game Sports Betting

Canada launched its legal single-game sports betting market late August just in time for the start of the NFL season and well ahead of the start of the NHL season (Oct. 12). Canada has long allowed sports lotteries and daily fantasy sports but has limited betting on games to 3-plus-team parlays and only in six of the country's ten provinces and through provincial-run agencies. Canadians are now able to make single bets on games. **Projections put Canada's betting** handle at upwards of \$30 billion a year by 2026.

# Finding the Best Blood Pressure Monitor for You

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

I just found out I have stage 1 hypertension and my doctor recommended I get a home blood pressure monitor to keep an eye on it. Can you offer me any tips on choosing a good one? — **Hypertensive Helen** 

#### Dear Helen,

It's a smart idea! Everyone with elevated or high blood pressure (stage 1 and higher) should consider getting a home blood pressure monitor. Home monitoring can help you keep tabs on your blood pressure in a comfortable setting. Plus, if you're taking medication it will make certain it's working, and alert you to a health problem if it arises. Here are some tips to help you choose a good monitor.

#### **Types of Monitors**

The two most popular types of home blood pressure monitors sold today are automatic arm monitors, and automatic wrist monitors that are electric and/or battery powered.

With an automatic arm monitor, you simply wrap the cuff around your bicep and with the push of one button the cuff inflates and deflates automatically giving you your blood pressure reading on the display window in a matter of seconds.

Wrist monitors work similarly, except they attach to the wrist. Wrist monitors are also smaller in weight and size, which makes them more portable, and a bit more comfortable to use than the arm monitors, but they tend to be a little less accurate. To help you choose the best monitor for you, here are several things to check into:

**Make sure it fits:** Be sure the cuff fits the circumference of your upper arm. Using a cuff that's the wrong size can result in an inaccurate reading. Most arm models have two sizes or an adjustable cuff that fits most people. Wrist models also fit most people.

**Choose one that's easy to use:** Be sure the display on the monitor is easy to read, and that the buttons are large. The directions for applying the cuff and operating the monitor should be clear.

**Consider what extra features** you want: Many automatic monitors come with additional features such as irregular heartbeat detection that checks for arrhythmias and other abnormalities; a risk category indicator that tells you whether your blood pressure is in the high range; a data-averaging function that allows you to take multiple readings and get an overall average; multiple user memory that allows two or more users to save their readings; and downloadable memory that lets you transmit your data to your computer or smartphone.

#### Where to Buy

You can find blood pressure monitors at pharmacies, medical supply stores or online, and you don't need a prescription to buy one. Prices typically range between \$40 and \$100.

In most cases, original Medicare will not cover a home blood pressure monitor, but if you have a Medicare Advantage plan or a private health insurance policy it's worth checking into, because some plans may provide coverage. The best automatic arm

After you buy a monitor, it's a good idea to take it to your doctor's office so they can check its accuracy and teach you the proper techniques of how and when to use it.

# Senior News Save Money With Phone Plans, Price Matching

With the price of everything going up, we need to save our dollars every place we can. Here are two ideas:

**PHONE PLANS** — If you want to save money on your cellphone plan or the cost of a new phone, there are a dozen or so providers that offer reduced-rate plans for seniors. Some offer a new phone, some will let you use your existing phone and many will let you keep your current phone number. Most offer unlimited talk and text, but prices will vary based on download speeds and data caps. Most also don't require a contract, but if part of the deal is to buy a new phone from them, you might run into a penalty if you cancel before the phone is paid for.

Call around to the phone service providers in your area and ask about senior plans. Be sure to look at their websites to check out the phones. You might need larger buttons or other special features. Better yet, if they have a store near you, go look at the phones in person. Don't let yourself be talked into a long contract that you don't want.


#### Dear Joseph,

Luckily, there is always the Internet. Two web sites I found— <u>bingojourney.com/bingo-patterns.</u> <u>htm</u> and <u>nationwidebingo.com/</u> <u>patterns.cfm</u>—provide dozens of popular Bingo patterns organized alphabetically. (There are some listed that I've never heard of. Has anyone out there ever played "Field Goal?") Just print out the page and take it with you the next time you head to Bingo.

If you need something different from the two examples I've provided, simply go to Google and search under "Bingo Card Patterns" for plenty of alternatives. — **Guy**

**PRICE MATCHING** — This is a good way to get deals on things you want if you hunt for bargains. Some stores make it their policy to match lower prices found elsewhere. You'll need to have proof, however, meaning they'll need to see the current price on the competitor's website. Your best bet is to call and ask whether they'll look online right from their store, or if it's enough for you to print out the competitor's online ad. It's mostly the bigger chains that have these policies, but even a local store might be willing to price match just to get your business.

Here are more success stories.

# Mega Millions Winners Honor Parents With Park

When John and Linda Kutey's office lottery pool won one of Mega Millions' biggest jackpots, the Kuteys knew that they wanted to pay respect to their parents by doing something for their community. So they went to the Green Island village hall and asked how they could help. The answer was to help renovate a local park, replacing an older wading pool with a modern spray park. The spray park gives local children a place to cool off in the summer, and it didn't cost the taxpayers a cent. The Kuteys not only donated the new equipment but also everything needed to install it. The Kuteys were also able to make some personal improvements with the lottery money. John Kutey was able to leave his job and he and his wife moved to a beautiful house in Florida.

# Florida Lottery Winner Leaves a Legacy of Good Works

Sheelah Ryan won \$52 million in the Florida State Lottery, which at the time was the biggest individual lottery jackpot ever won. She then spent the last years of her life giving it away. As many lottery winners have said, she felt that she had won the money for a reason, and that reason was to help others. She created a charitable group to help organizations that provide aid for the underprivileged. Ryan only had six years to enjoy her winnings before dying of cancer, but The Ryan Foundation outlasted her, continuing to give grants to organizations that built lowcost housing, helped children who in need of operations they couldn't afford, and aided senior citizens, especially in her home of Seminole County, Florida.

# Man Donates Lottery Jackpot to Fight Disease

Most people who win the lottery make plans to quit their job, travel the world, or buy a new house or car. But when Tom Crist won \$40 million in a Canadian lottery, he had a very different idea. He donated every single dollar to fight the disease that killed his wife. Two years earlier, Tom had lost his wife of 44 years, Jan, to cancer. He was retired, had money saved up, and his adult children were doing well, so he decided not to keep any of it for himself at all. With the full approval of his kids, he donated the entire lump sum to a cancer charity in Calgary.

# School Teacher Uses Jackpot to Bring Joy to Children

Les Robins was a high school teacher who thought it was a shame that kids today don't grow up doing the kinds of activities he himself had enjoyed as a child: going to camp, swimming, playing sports, and exploring the outdoors. So when he won a \$111 million Powerball jackpot, Robins decided to use the funds to create his own camp to bring joy to kids. **Robins founded Camp Winnegator** on 226 acres that he bought with his lottery money, and it operated for over a decade. It provided children a low-cost place to go in the summer where they could horseback ride, craft, swim, and play on the lake. Best of all, the kids had a chance to disconnect from video games and cell phones and get in touch with nature and their real-life friends

# To Your Good Health Ask Dr. Roach: CBD Oil

DEAR DR. ROACH: My son is taking hemp-based CBD oil for depression. He purchased this at a health food store. His doctor prescribed pills that he was unable to tolerate due to suicidal thoughts. He is unable to go outside when taking CBD. We would like to know if it will show up in a drug test as part of a job interview. Should he be taking it? — D.

better safety and effectiveness data than CBD.

Most forensic drug testing uses THC and its metabolites, so if what your son is taking is truly CBD, then it should not be identified during testing as THC. There is a chance that the "CBD oil" he purchased has THC in it: In one study, 57% of CBD oils sold were found to have measurable THC, which would show up on a drug test. Unfortunately, 25% of the oils contained no CBD at all.

Q: How do I sell three programs from the 1969 Woodstock festival that are in excellent condition, and what is the range of their value?

# Go' Move

#### By Chad Holloway

A lot of things separate professionals from amateurs in poker. One of the most important differences is that pros have a bag of tricks filled to the brim, while an amateur or recreational player tends to rely on a limited number or moves — bet, check, raise, fold or move all in.

One strategy that some pros will execute when the opportunity presents itself is the stop-and-go, which can only be done under specific circumstances. When a player is short-stacked in the blinds with a bad hand, a stopand-go play may be in order.

Imagine you're in the big blind and a player raises the minimum. You don't have a lot of chips and look down at a mediocre hand. It's not strong enough to move all in with, but you don't want to fold it to such a small raise.

Instead, you may consider a stop-and-go, which means to just call the raise (the "stop" part of the equation) and, if you hit any part of the flop, to move all in (the "go").

A recent hand of online poker demonstrated this play perfectly. The hand took place

in the 2021 Pennsylvania Spring Championship of Online Poker. Play had reached Level 17 (blinds of 3,000-6,000 with an ante of 750) in a \$200-buy-in no-limit hold'em event.

It started when a player with the online handle BYAH20 players choose a screen name and can play anonymously online — raised to 13,800 from middle position. Barrett Lipkin, sitting on a stack of 46,000 in chips, looked down at Qs 4s. It wasn't a great hand, but with 6,000 already committed in the big blind, it would cost just 7,800 more for Lipkin to see a flop.

Lipkin made the call and then executed the stop-and-go play when the flop came down 7s 2s 2c. Lipkin didn't pair up, but he did flop a spade flush draw. By moving all in for his last 32,200, he was trying to take advantage of his fold equity, which is the equity a player can expect to gain due to an opponent folding to his or her bets.

Even if BYAH20 called, which he eventually did with just Ac Jc, Lipkin could always get lucky. So, the stop-and-go is a twofold move in that (1) you hit the flop just enough to move all in and hopefully take advantage of your fold equity, and (2) if you get called, you're still drawing live to win the pot.

Here, Lipkin was looking to either complete his flush or pair one of his cards. Unfortunately for him, neither the Kd turn nor the 8d river did it, and he was eliminated from the tournament.

While the end result wasn't what he wanted, Lipkin's stop-andgo attempt was admirable. Now that you know how it's done, you might consider adding the stopand-go to your poker bag of tricks.

# Video Poker: Tales of Yesterday

#### by Gayle Mitchell

In this article, we will explore some examples of the better video poker (VP) versions of yesterday and then move forward to the best strategies for play today whether online or off.

Pay schedules posted at VP slots are the first step to strategic play. The full pay VP versions have evolved to short pay over the years, therefore, I offer alternative options for VP play as detailed below.

For Jacks or Better, players should scan the 1 coin payout vertical for poker hands specifically for a 9/6 (nine coins for a full house, and 6 coins for a flush=full pay). Multiply by 5 for max coin return.

Jacks or Better (Jacks+) 9/6 one-coin return + max Pays 2 for 2 pair

Flush (FL) (non-sequential, same suit) 6 max = 30 Full house (FH) (3 of a kind and a pair)

9 max = 45

Full Pay 8/5 Bonus Poker pays less than Jack+ because of higher payouts of four aces = 400 and four 2s, 3s or 4s = 200. Bonus Poker 8/5 one-coin return + max Pays 2 for 2 pair

Flush (FL) (non-sequential, same suit) 5 = 25 Full house (FH) (3 of a kind and a pair) 8 = 40

Another example from yesterday was the full-pay 10/7 Double Bonus Video Poker paytable.

Double Bonus 10/7 VP one-coin return + max Flush (FL) (non-sequential, same suit) 7 = 35 Full house (FH) (3 of a kind and a pair) 10 = 50

The majority of payout

4-of-a-kind (quad) 5 = 25Straight Flush 9 = 45

Jokers Wild 9/5 full pay one-coin return + max Kings or Better & Quad pays 100 max.

Flush (FL) (non-sequential, same suit) 5 = 25 Full house (FH) (3 of a kind and a pair) 7 = 35

TODAY: Deuces: look for 9/4 payouts and 125 for Wild Royal. Try Bonus Deuces version offering larger pays for five 3s, 4s, 5s and Aces.

Jokers: locate at least 80 coin for 4-of-a-kind. 4,700 Royal. Kings or Better only, avoid 2 pair minimum pay tables. Don't play 500 coin payout for Natural Royal.

While this advice does not include strategic play for each version; taking the time to locate the best version and playing maximum coin is a good plan to profit in VP land.
