Noble County Drop Box Drug Disposal Program

Open the medicine cabinet or a kitchen cabinet in many homes and you are likely to find an array of prescription and over the counter medications. Many of those medications are expired or no longer needed or used. What happens to those medications?

According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration's more than 7 million Americans currently abuse prescription drugs.

Teens and adults both often mistakenly believe that abusing them is "safer" than other drugs.

At one point or another, most people have used prescription drugs or over-the-counter (OTC) medicines. A DFNC coalition member recently purged a kitchen cabinet of unused/expired medicines filling an entire bag! This bag was properly disposed at one of Noble County's Four Permanent 24/7 Medicine Disposal Sites!



Many abused prescription and over the counter drugs are obtained from family and friends. Often the medications are no longer needed or used and the person they were prescribed for does not even know they are missing!

Drug Free Noble County in partnership with local law enforcement and Northeast Indiana Solid Waste Management District have established four permanent drop box locations.
