

Edward Miller, MD began his tenure in 1977 as the first CEO ever of Johns Hopkins Medicine. For the next 16 years, he oversaw a building boom at Hopkins creating a system with international division, 6 hospitals and more than 30 primary and specialty facilities. He overhauled the medical school curriculum and built new research facilities. Under his leadership he helped make first-class health care available throughout the world through partnerships with Asia, Latin America, the Middle East, Europe, the Caribbean and elsewhere. Dr. Miller also signed an agreement to help Malaysia develop a private integrated medical school and teaching hospital.
