Last Wednesday June 24th 2020, the Church celebrated the Solemnity of the birth of John the Baptist. John's birth brought great joy to Zechariah and Elizabeth. Jesus spoke of John as the greatest of all people ever born by a woman. John preceded Jesus in birth and death.

On Monday June 29th the Church will be celebrating another Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul- the Principal Pillars on which Jesus founded his Church.

This week we will enter the month of July as well as Phase Three of our Transition an ease on the lockdown imposed to us due to Covid-19. On Saturday is the celebration of the USA Independence Day Anniversary. Let us continue to be thankful to God for the progress and advancement and all so far attained in this great Nation.
