Dear everyone, Happy St. Patrick's Day!

With the arrival of spring close at hand, we have a number of up-coming activities scheduled to keep everyone busy during the warmer days ahead:

1. The Worcester County Commission on Aging is looking for people from our chapter to participate in the St. Patrick's Day Parade on March 17. Parade participants will be treated to breakfast and lunch and can ride the parade route in one of the buses that will be provided. Sign-up at the Senior Center if you are interested.

2. On April 6, a jazz ensemble/dinner event will be held at the Ocean City Senior Center from 5-7 pm. Dinner will be catered by the Decatur Diner and door prizes will be awarded. Tickets are available (\$15 pp.) at the Senior Center.

4. A trip to Atlantic City's Tropicana Resort Casino will be run on April 30. 5. The 2018 Ocean City Health Fair will be held on May 8 from 8-12:30 am. at the Ocean City Convention Center. This is a great opportunity to have some free health screenings and obtain other medical information. There is no charge to attend this event. We also need some volunteers to help with this event.

6. Your local AARP chapter will again host a luncheon on June 14 at the conclusion of our general meeting. Subs, soda, and water will be provided. Additional information will follow.

## **INFORMATIONAL SPEAKERS and meeting fun**

speaker, from the Fire Marshall's office provided a plethora of information on fire and accident prevention for everyone, but more especially cautionary issues for seniors. She also noted that Carbon monoxide detectors are more common now for anyone who has gas heat or fireplaces. New smoke and fire detectors now last 10 years without annual battery replacement. She advised us to contact the local fire department for possible replacement of the older models. Fire detectors were not made to last more than 10 years.



Mr. Bruce Young of Shepherd's Crook spoke in February and appraised the group of many pertinent facts regarding this great community resource. Shepherd's Crook is a food pantry located at 201 S. Baltimore Avenue having served over 16,000 people in 2017. Open 5 days a week from 10-12 except on Wednesdays and Sundays, clients number 61 per day off season and often over 125 daily during summer months. Clients include senior citizens, the homeless and J-1 students in the summer. Shepherd's Crook always welcomes donations of non-perishable food items and personal hygiene items. Without these donations from individuals and local businesses this service would be short lived. Our chapter will be collecting food and hygiene at our March meeting. Please remember to bring items for this effort.
