
'appy to be with you, Mates:

In the Cricket Doubles RON CLOUTIER/  
FRANK DETMAN lost to DAVE KELLY and TOMMY  
O'REAGAN. O'Reagan, presently a resident  
of the USA, was the 1970, 1971 and 1972  
British National Dart Association (NDA)  
Individual Champ.

The third leg finished up with Ruth shooting,  
with 181 left, T33, leaving 48. Frank

BAMBI MULLIKIN whipped a pair of top notch  
West Coast darters SANDY REITAN and KATY

next match.

The Open Doubles first place win by Ron  
and Frank was an uphill battle all the way.  
Our guys took the measure of FRANK ENNIS/  
RICK WOBENSMITH (3 legs). DAN PUCILLO/

CAL PETERS, in his wins to the runner-up  
spot in the Open Singles, took the measure

## CINCINNATI CAPERS

The Open Singles winner, DAVE MILLER,  
fired three 18-dart games to take FRANK  
DETMAN in the final third leg. Both Dave  
and Frank shot excellent darts. T20s and  
T40s were commonplace shots resulting in an  
outstanding and interesting match.

To reach the finals in the Open Singles  
Frank Detman had to eliminate DAVE SMITH,  
in the Top 64 bracket, by winning the third  
leg in 13 darts; T40, T, T, T25, X18. As in  
football the momentum developed hovered  
above the head of Frank like a halo for the  
remainder of the competition. In the Top 32  
bracket DAN PUCILLO was whipped when Frank  
took the second leg with a T26 outshot and,  
with 50 left, hit a single bull and then  
took out the remaining 25 in two darts to  
win the third leg and match.

In the Top 8 Frank took JERRY BAKER,  
Kansas City, 3 to 2, in one shot after  
Jerry missed his double in the fifth leg.  
The Top 4 match was a 3 to 1 win over TOMMY

**New Business:**

Pat Roberts informed the members that the Daytonian Hilton has expressed an interest in housing a dart tournament. They would give special room rates and a percentage of bar and restaurant receipts.

Discussed possibility of holding an ADO 3-day national tournament for \$5,000-10,000. DDA would have to guarantee the money. Figured we would need at least a \$10,000 tournament to draw big national shooters and possibly the British, if the timing were right.

Would need to inform DDA membership of proposed plan and have an open membership vote at a designated meeting to approve money being spent.

An alternative idea was to hold an Ohio State Championship Tournament. This would need to be a \$5,000-6,000 tourney.

An ad hoc committee was to be formed to study the possibilities and prepare a presentation for possible sponsors. Gene Cramer was appointed chairman of the committee.

Board members were asked to solicit sponsors to donate money, advertising, trophies, etc.

TV and newspaper coverage should be encouraged to cover the tournaments and other DDA darting activities.

**Raffles:**

Pat Roberts proposed a raffle to raise money. Would raffle an item that will appeal to everyone--not just darters--such

as a TV or video equipment; or a trip for two to Las Vegas. A suggestion was made that the member who sells the winning ticket also win a prize. This would be an incentive to sell more tickets.

By next meeting, members are to report on sponsor donations for the raffle. The objective is to raise \$3,000.

Divisional Championships:

Divisional Representatives were informed they will be running the championships. There will be three individual event playoffs. All will be single round robin.

- November 3 - Cricket
- January 19 - 501
- March 15 - 301

There is a \$2 entry fee each event. The top point winner each night will win that round. At a time to be determined, the event champions will play off for title of Division Champion. The three (two or one) event champions will receive prize money and trophy. Division Champion will receive a shirt.

Divisional Reps are to contact teams in their division, arrange location, and run playoff. They are to contact bars in their division to try to get donations to purchase trophies.

Pat Roberts reported the financial reports have been submitted and are up to date.

Minutes from last meeting were read, corrected and approved.

Open Discussion:

Enrollment is open for more novice teams. Play will be Thursday nights. Deadline for applications is November 3. Play begins November 10.

Challenge Team:

Dayton has been included in the Quad City Challenge December 3 and 4. We need 24 men and 12 women. Members are determined by average score of 30 darts. Julie explained qualifying procedures. Divisional reps are authorized to run qualifying rounds. Deadline for qualifying is November 2.

Meeting adjourned at 10:10 PM.

A recent unfortunate incident occurred during a dart match which involved members of opposing teams. The sponsoring lounge owner naturally was concerned as was the leadership group of the DDA. The incident involved physical contact of an uncontrolled nature. This was indeed unfortunate and uncalled for.

Any competition involving skills, techniques, finesse agility, mobility, strength, reasoning, etc., requires a well adjusted mental attitude and a certain stability of composure. Courtesies are paramount in any living situation and, without doubt, darts is a living situation. A mal-adjusted mental attitude in a discourteous situation can be frustrating and embarrassing.

Your Editor has been involved in a wide variety of athletic competition for over 40 years as competitor, supervisor and coach, and is well aware of the mental and emotional stresses involved in the struggle to become a winner. The crescendo of a verbose opponent and the poor performance of a darter overtaxes the mental and emotional capacity to the breaking point. The built up stresses may result in a vocal and/or physical outburst. This is unfortunate. Isn't it strange-----, you never see or hear of a winner become the instigator of a physical confrontation.

So we deal with a person in a losing cause. Next time you shoot take notice of a loser. You will be able to classify losers as 1) good; 2) dumbfounded; 3) sulking; and 4) poor. The good loser is the guy who is always complimenting his opponent on his shot and especially after the match is over.

The dumbfounded loser is the one, usually considered a better shooter, who looks dazed, and, is amazed, after losing to what is considered an inferior opponent. If there is any verbal reaction, it is a muffled congratulatory remark.

Over the past several months, the Board members and I have been informed of, or witnessed, examples of poor sportsmanship and gross infractions of dart etiquette. These infractions have ranged from an individual purposely stepping on an opponent's foot, during their throw, to a wrestling match under the bar stools. 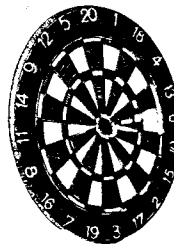
7. (C) SPORTSMANSHIP

But Buckingham Palace denied the reports, and landlord Peter Adams of the Baker's Arms Tavern said that, although he recalled ordering a group of Cambridge University students to go, he couldn't be sure whether 19-year-old Edward was among them.

"A group of young people came running in and demanded drinks," Adams said. "We had a very important darts match on at the time, and the players were being disturbed. I told the students: 'I think you have had a few (drinks) too many and I am not going to serve you.' They left quietly."
