## Briefs From the Board

#### WHAT ARE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF CLASS COORDINATORS

Name tags in plastic holders are created for the new members (Sherwin Silver does this for us) and we have them available on the counter every Wednesday for them to wear. We plan a few social events for our new class and also workshops as needed for dancers who need extra help.

In addition to this, as coordinators, we attend all board meetings and coordinate graduation. Our Rail Dusters are the future of our club. and each dancer has their own unique history and skill at learning new calls. We have our own internal timelines, and we try to encourage understanding patience. and friendship among our dancers. It is one of the most gratifying jobs in the club.
