Resolved that the policy for district water for pool filling etc. be adopted as follows:

USE OF DISTRICT WATER FOR POOL FILLING Etc.

Per *Article*. *VIII*, *Section 1* of the State Constitution, No county, city, town, village or school district shall give or loan any money or property to or in aid of any individual, or private corporation or association, or private undertaking; therefore, all persons using water from the Town of Randolph Water District shall be charged the same rate for water as district customers.

The Town of Randolph Water District rate for up to 3,000 gallons of water is \$35.00. Each additional 1,000 gallons above that is charged a rate of \$3.50 per 1,000 gallons.

Any Water District customer requesting a pool filling will have the initial \$35.00/3,000 gallon rate waived if said customer's Water account is current and paid in full at time of the pool filling and will be charged \$3.50 per 1,000 gallons.
