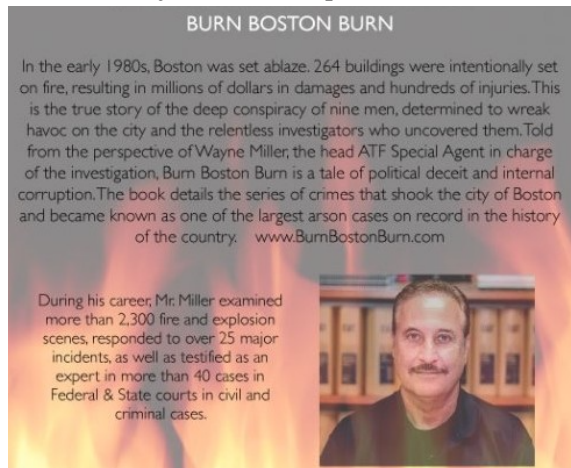

He has been involved in numerous high-profile illegal firearms, bombings, and arson cases, and as a member of the ATF National Response Team, Mr. Miller responded to several major fire and explosion incidents. During his public and private career, he examined more than



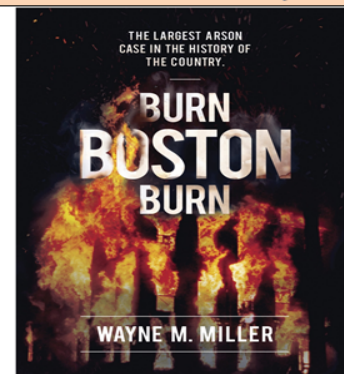
2,300 fire and explosion scenes, plus provided expert testimony in numerous Federal and State courts. After retiring from ATF in 2001, Wayne worked privately for 18 years, eventually working fire and explosion scenes in 43 States. Wayne has been a member of the International Association of Arson Investigators since 1984 and has held numerous positions within the MA Chapter of the IAAI. Besides teaching fire investigation as an Adjunct Professor at Cape Cod Community College for two semesters, he has been a speaker on fire-related topics over 80 times throughout the United States and in Canada.
