Words From the Pastor

Over the last month, as Tasha and I continue to prepare for our departure, we've spent a far bit of time working on our home here in Wabash getting it ready to sell. A large part of this has been working on long-deferred projects. These are things that we had always intended to do to the house, but that we had simply never gotten around to actually working on.

Some years ago, we had pulled down wood paneling in our bedroom, only to find that the previous owners had put that up to cover up the mess that the walls were in that bedroom. First off, the walls were painted a hideous pink color. But the bigger problem was that there were a number of large holes cut in the walls – holes that would need to be fixed before we could move forward on addressing the paint color. So, for a number of years, we simply lived with the walls in this condition – always intending to do something about them, yet just never really finding the time to do something about it.

Finally, as it became clearer that we would be moving earlier this year, we began to move forward on doing something about the walls. We started off by painting two of the walls that did not have large holes in them – and the change in the room just with two walls painted a decent color was amazing. Then, in my week off in April, I spent a good bit of time finishing up the hole repairs, and repainting. I also put up baseboard trim and crown molding, and finished up by putting casing around the two windows in the bedroom. Now, when I walk in the room, it feels like a finished room. It took some time, but the finished room is much nicer. And I thought, I should have worked on this a lot sooner, so that we'd have had a nice place to live in for a number of years, instead of the month and half we've got left in this house at this point.

As I thought about that, I realized that often, we learn to live with things that, with just a bit of work to change, would make our lives and our faith stronger and better. For example, perhaps you've always had the idea that you would like to pray on a more regular basis, or would like to add to the time of prayer that you do already. But often, we get caught up with other activities, other habits, and this change gets pushed to the back burner. Yet, when we take the time to really implement such a change, we realize that the difference it makes is well worth the extra time and effort required to do it.

I want to invite you to think about something that you've been meaning to do in your life of faith that, for whatever reason, has gotten side-tracked or put on the back burner of your life. When you do, take time this month to make that change, to follow after whatever spiritual practice or discipline or activities that you've been meaning to do. And see what God will do with that change – I suspect that you'll find it has been well worth the extra effort!

ACCOUNT SETUP

Go to www.campmack.org. Click the "Register" button at the top right of the page.

Existing accounts, 1) Click "Forgot your login information." 2) Choose "I need to reset my password." Your login will not change.

Need an account? 1) Click "New User."

- If the participant is an adult, create the account under the participant name. If the participant is a minor, create an account with the parent/guardian information.
- Follow the instructions to create your profile.

ONLINE REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Click "Register" next to the name of the participant.
- Select the program you wish to attend. Click on the "Info" button for more information. Click "Register."
- If registering another family member for an event, click "Yes." If not, click "No, continue registration."
- Confirm participant information and emergency contacts, and choose session options (if applicable).
- Fill out the required form(s) and sign the waiver, then click "Next."
- Click "Proceed to Payment." If you have a sponsorship code from your church, school, or other organization, click "+Add sponsorship/promotional code" and enter the code.
- A \$75 deposit is required for all summer camps in order to be registered. Full payment is required by June 1st. Enter payment information, then click "Submit Payment."
