The Power of a Personal Invitation

— Who might be waiting for you to invite them to share the joy of worship with friends?

A special thanks to Herman Sikes, Harry Bradshaw, Jerry Teachey, and Alan Baker for creating the Sound and Projection Booth in the Fellowship hall. That allowed us to move the sound equipment and wires behind the wall and create more space for people in our early service...

...and just in time, too, because we had 149 people in our 9:00am Easter worship gathering. Thankfully we had just purchased four more tables, so we had room for everyone.

But as you look around that worship gathering, you see so many faces that are new to us. And if you know their stories, you can "connect the dots" on how they became a part of the First Baptist family. It was all through relationships and invitations:

- A co-worker was invited,
- A family member was invited,
- A neighbor was invited,
- A friend was invited.
- An acquaintance was invited...

And they came once or twice and found the joyful worship, the caring friends, and the Bible truth their hearts were hungry for.

What are the ingredients of a good invitation?

- 1. You must be genuinely excited about what you are inviting them to experience. If you look half-dead, dissatisfied, and bored when you're there, why would they get excited about it? Some people who say they love their church forgot to tell their face!
- 2. You must genuinely love them. If your invitation is to benefit you, not them, they won't be interested. In another church, a lady lamented, "I wish people would come to sing in our choir." So her main motivation was not their benefit, but to improve her worship experience. No surprise that she didn't succeed in reaching anyone!
- 3. Let your first invitation be not "to your church" but "into your life." If you want this person to be in heaven with you for eternity, then invite them to come to your house for a slice of pie or a cookout. Invite them out for a pizza dinner. Invite them to go fishing. Show them that you care about them outside of church so they will know you'll care about them inside of church. Jesus spent time with those in spiritual need.

4. Take advantage of special celebrations. "Why is he/she inviting me NOW?" they might ask.

There are special times that we want to share with others. Baptisms, recognitions, graduation, parent-child dedication services, Mother's Day, Father's Day, fun events and trips... One reason why we have sermon series in worship is so that, if that topic might help you invite someone, you have another good opportunity!

If you need a special recognition to help you invite someone, by golly, we'll create one just for you!

And we have a lot of things coming up that are wonderful opportunities to invite others:


Worship




Senior Adults


