299 Nebraska -9.5 -6.5 22 Under: 0.5

300 Illinois 56.5 52.5 30 Cover: 14.5

-Nebraska had a 392-326 yard edge but were done in by costly mistakes.

-Nebraska QB Martinez was 16 of 32 for 232 yards and ran for 111 yards but missed wide open receivers and had a lost fumble that was returned for a TD.

-Illinois starting QB Brandon Peters left the game holding his non-throwing shoulder after being sacked hard near the end of the 1Q. He did not return and was replaced by Artur Sitkowski, a transfer from Rutgers. Sitkowski was 12 of 15 with a 2-0 ratio.

302 UCLA -14 -18 44 Cover: 16

-UCLA had a 392-269 yard edge including 244-26 on the ground.

-UCLA was +2 in TO's and also took advantage of two special teams errors by Hawaii.

-UCLA RB Zach Charbonnet — who was at Michigan the past 2 years ran for 3 TD's.

-UCLA scored on its first five possessions and roared out to a 31-3 halftime lead as it snapped an eight-game losing streak to non-conference teams dating back to 2017.

-"No excuses. We just played poorly. We played poorly, we coached poorly, and we got beat by a team that was better than us today," Hawaii coach Graham said.

-The game had an announced attendance of 32,982, which is the second-lowest for a UCLA game since the Bruins moved to the Rose Bowl in 1982.

-Fresno QB Haener threw for 331 yards and Fresno started its 100th year of football.

-Haener left the contest on the Bulldogs' first drive of the second half due to apparent leg cramps as temperatures on the field reached 120 degrees.

-The Huskies (0-1) made their first-ever trip to Fresno, California. The contest marked their first game since Nov. 30, 2019.

3★ RUTGERS 37 Temple 20. Rutgers was much improved in year one under Greg Schiano and will be even better this year with 20 returning starters. Last year they went from -33 ppg in Big Ten play to -5 ppg! They finally have some stability at offensive coordinator as Sean Gleeson returns for his 2nd year (one of the most underrated OC's in the country). Prior to Gleeson, Rutgers had 11 different OC's in 11 years. Meanwhile, Temple had a pitiful 2020 season getting outscored by 17 ppg. While they are improved this year, they only return 13 starters (3 less than the national average). We bet Rutgers -11.5 in this one earlier this summer and still like Rutgers. Also as long as the weather stays dry, we lean with the OVER.

UCF 37 Boise St 30. One of the better Group of 5 games in recent memory. You have some uncertainty here with two new coaches in their first game. Andy Avalos takes over at Boise where he played and coached here. Boise should much improved with 17 returning starters. Last year was a season to forget as Boise's 349 ypg on offense was their worst since 1996 and the 27 ppg allowed was their most since 1998. On the other side, Gus Malzahn inherits a UCF program that vastly underachieved a year ago at 6-4. The offense has averaged at least 42 ppg in 4 consecutive seasons and it should again this year thanks to the return of QB Dillon Gabriel. The question is can a defense that allowed 33 ppg be improved enough for UCF to make a run again at a New Year's 6 bowl? We bet Boise St +10 way back in May but would lean with UCF at the current "5" number. Remember, we bet numbers, not teams.

† **Appalachian St 33 East Carolina 24.** Played at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, NC. We think this will be Mike Houston's best team yet at ECU. The Pirates return 20 starters and started showing signs of improvement at the end of last season with wins over Temple and an upset of SMU. Holton Ahlers returns at QB for his 4th year and we've been reading good things about the defense in fall camp. On the other side, App St who had their 3rd coach in 3 years, took a bit of step back last year at 9-3 (were 28-3 in their previous 31 games). The Mountaineers have to replace a 4-year starter at QB and Duke transfer Chase Brice will get the start. Brice struggled big time with TO's last year throwing 15 INT's. The defense should be salty though with 10 returning starters. We lean with ECU here and a sharp betting group hit the UNDER on Monday morning.

NC STATE 39 South Florida 20. USF head coach Jeff Scott had a tough first season in Tampa last year as the Bulls went 1-8 and allowed a program worst 40 ppg on defense. This year's team is much better with 17 returning starters but we're still not expecting much out of them this season. On the other side, NC State has Top 25 potential this year (if we're talking a pure power rating). The Wolf Pack went 8-4 a year ago and return 18 starters. We like the overall talent as long as QB Devin Leary stays healthy. The problem is a schedule that sees them play Miami and North Carolina out of the Coastal. We bet NC State at -16.5 earlier this summer but the line has crossed through a relative important number of 17. We're passing now.

TENNESSEE 50 Bowling Green 13. First game for new Tennessee head coach Josh Heupel. He inherits a tough situation as the Vols only return 11 starters and saw 25 players hit the transfer portal (most in the Power 5). Michigan transfer Joe Milton will get the start at QB and Heupel will want to push the tempo here. The defense looked awful in the spring especially at LB. Speaking of awful, the once-solid Bowling Green program that has seen Urban Meyer, Dave Clawson and Dino Babers roam the sidelines in the last 20 years is just 12-41 straight up the last 5 years. Remarkably, the Falcons are 15-38 ATS in that span as the betting markets can't downgrade their ineptitude fast enough. We don't see it getting much better this year as BG only return 11 starters and had a whopping 70 freshman and redshirt freshman on their roster in the spring. We bet Tennessee (-27.5) on the opener and even after an 8-point line move, would still lean with the Vols!

2★ UNDER 64 Ohio St 37 MINNESOTA 23. With only 12 returning starters and the loss of one of the best QB's in Ohio St history, it's still not a question of rebuild anymore in Columbus. The Buckeyes reload every year and just signed their best recruiting class in school history. CJ Stroud will get the start at QB and we bet him 40/1 to win the Heisman. It's more about the weapons surrounding him as the RB's are loaded (keep an eye out for true freshman Treveyan Henderson). The WR corps is quite simply the best unit in all of CFB. They have two 1st-team All-Americans in Garrett Wilson and Chris Olave and multiple 5-star recruits backing them up. If the Buckeyes want to win the National Title, the defense has to improve after allowing 26 ppg and more than 400 ypg a year ago. They do lose their top 5 tacklers. On the other side, Minnesota should be much improved this year thanks to 20 returning starters. Tanner Morgan is back at QB and RB Mohamed Ibrahim ran for more than 1,000 yards in just 7 games last year. The biggest question mark comes at WR where the Gophers lost Rashod Bateman (1st-round draft pick) and their top returning receiver Chris Autman-Bell has been banged up in fall camp. They do return 182 career starts on the offensive line (2nd most in CFB history) and should try to play keep away from the Buckeyes' offense by running the ball. We like the UNDER.

Friday, September 3rd
North Carolina 34 VIRGINIA TECH 28. The Tar Heels, fresh off their first major bowl game since 1950 return 17 starters. They are led by arguably the best QB in

CFB in Sam Howell who returns for his 3rd year. In his freshman and sophomore seasons, Howell has a 68-to-14 TD-to-INT ratio. He does lose his top two RB's and top 2 receivers but NC is still talented. Keep an eye out for WR Josh Downs and Tennessee transfer RB Ty Chandler. The Heels should be much improved at the line of scrimmage (return every starter on OL/DL). On the other side, VT head coach Justin Fuente is on the hot seat. The Hokies are just 19-18 the last 3 years and recruiting hasn't been great. After a rare losing season a year ago, we don't see a massive jump. "Enter Sandman" should be rocking Lane Stadium after no fans a year ago and that's the only thing preventing us from liking the Tar Heels here as these two grams are heading in opposite directions.

WAKE FOREST 46 Old Dominion 14. This could be Dave Clawson's best team at Wake. That's saying something considering they've been to 5 straight bowl games. They did lose a couple of offensive starters in fall camp in WR Donavon Greene (20.1 yards per catch last year) and RT Je'Vionte' Nash. Still, Sam Hartman is back at QB along with everybody else. On the other side, there's a ton of uncertainty for ODU. The Monarchs went 1-11 in 2019 and fired their only coach since restarting the program. New head coach Ricky Rahne saw the school cancel the 2020 season due to COVID while the rest of CUSA played. The Monarchs only return 9 starters from that pitiful 2019 team and this year's team could be worse (at least on paper). This is the largest point-spread ever for Wake against an FBS opponent and it is deserved. We pass on the side and lean UNDER.

Duke 34 CHARLOTTE 26. The Blue Devils are coming off their worst season since 2007 and a lot of their issues came down to TO's as they were dead last at -19. Only 12 starters return and we think this could be the final year for David Cutcliffe. He has done a remarkable job here but the program seems like it has been trending down the last couple of years and we don't see it getting much better this season. On the other side, Charlotte is coming off a disappointing 2-4 season. Chris Reynolds is back at QB for another year and we like WR Victor Tucker. However, the defense returns just 5 starters. This line seems a little cheap considering Cutcliffe usually does well in non-conference games with a 29-10 ATS record dating back to 2012. That includes a 53-10 win over Charlotte last year.

NORTHWESTERN 24 Michigan St 21. On one side, you have a Northwestern team that we think will take a step back from their Big Ten West division title season. The Wildcats only return 7 starters and have been a roller-coaster as of late with double-digit win seasons following losing seasons and vice versa. Clemson transfer Hunter Johnson will get the start at QB. On the other side, Michigan St head coach Mel Tucker inherited a really tough situation last year. He was hired after signing day and then spring practice was cancelled due to COVID. MSU only had 8 returning starters. While the stats weren't that great including allowing 35 ppg (most in school history), the Spartans won two key games vs Michigan and Northwestern as huge underdogs. They return 16 starters including all 5 starters on the OL as their 146 career starts are the 4th most in the country. This line opened with Northwestern as high as -7.5 at William Hill in the summer. Safe to say, we bet Michigan St at that number but now at "3", we're passing. We bet numbers, not teams!

Saturday, September 4th
MICHIGAN 41 Western Michigan 23. We have Michigan as the 2nd most improved team in the country this year behind LSU (see page 6). The Wolverines return 16 starters from last season's disastrous 2-4 campaign. Regardless of what the national media says, head coach Jim Harbaugh has done a solid job. Michigan was just 46-42 from 2008-2014 and Harbaugh has gone 49-22. With that being said, this is a big year for Harbaugh if he wants to be in Ann Arbor in 2022 (does he?). Cade McNamara will start at QB after impressing in his limited action last year (5-0 ratio). On the other side, this is a dangerous Western Michigan team. They did lose 3 of their top 4 players including WR D'Wayne Eskridge who was a 2nd round draft pick. However, QB Kaleb Eleby returns after he had a sensational 18-to-2 TD-to-INT ratio last year along with 18 other starters. We bet Michigan -15 early in the summer but prefer the UNDER now.

GEORGIA ST 25 Army 24. Two bowl teams from last year meet up in a sneaky good match-up. Army is coming off a 9-3 season a year ago but the schedule is much tougher this season (played 3 FCS teams last year). Still, they should be healthier at QB and the defense returns 8 starters from a unit that only allowed 15 ppg and 275 ypg last year. Georgia St returns 19 starters from a team that has made back-to-back bowls. Quad Brown is back at QB along with every other starter on offense and they scored 33 ppg last year. This is another game where we bet Army +4 early in the summer but wouldn't make that bet now after it crossed through a key "3" number.

2★ † Stanford 27 Kansas St 26. AT&T Stadium in Arlington, TX. We know it is an early start time for the Cardinal (9am PT) but we think they are the more talented team. The Cardinal return 15 starters from last year's team that played 4 straight road games to finish the season (all wins). They do lose their QB Davis Mills but we expect the run game to be improved on both sides of the ball. Keep an eye on DL Thomas Booker, he really impressed us in the spring. Meanwhile, Kansas St returns 16 starters from last year. They saw their QB Skylar Thompson go down in the 3rd game and they had to go to a true freshman in Will Howard. A very banged up Kansas St team would lose their last 5 games of the season after a 4-1 start. This is one of our biggest power ratings disparities in Week 1 and we will take the Cardinal here outright.

KENTUCKY 45 UL-Monroe 10. The Wildcats have been to 5 straight bowl games now but will have a new QB and a new OC this year. QB Will Lewis comes in from Penn St while new OC Liam Coen spent the last 3 years with the LA Rams. There's some unknown here and we usually wouldn't want to lay this kind of number with an offense that hasn't topped 27 ppg in each of the last 4 years. With that being said, ULM is a bottom 10 team nationally and the Warhawks enter 2021 on a 11-game losing streak. Last year ULM did not lead a single second all year! Terry Bowden is the new head coach but he had to leave the team for while during camp to attend his father's funeral. New OC Rich Rodriguez took over the duties in Bowden's absence and Rodriguez' son Rhett looks like he will be the starting QB. We bet Kentucky -27.5 and would still lean that way at the current number.

Oklahoma at Tulane was moved to Norman, OK because of Hurricane Ida and is now at the bottom of the rotation.

WISCONSIN 27 Penn St 22. This is a really good week one game involving two Top 10 teams in our power ratings. Both teams made our most improved list (see page 6) and both are about a TD better than what they were a year ago. After they opened 0-5 for the first time in school history last year (134 years), the Nittany Lions won their final 4 games. Penn St brings back 15 starters led by QB Sean Clifford and WR Jahan Dotson. On the other side, Wisconsin returns 16 starters and each of their last 3 recruiting classes have been the top 3 in school history with last year's class (No. 16) the best. QB Graham Mertz should be improved in year 2 especially with head coach Paul Chryst calling plays again. We have Wisconsin favored in all 12 regular season games but this is close to our projections. We bet more than half the week one games, this wasn't one of them.

ARKANSAS 38 Rice 17. We think both programs are heading in the right direction. After a 2-30 stretch from 2017-2019, Rice has won 5 of their last 8 games including a win over #15 Marshall last year as a 24.5-point underdog. The Owls return 19 starters and QB transfer Luke McCaffrey is competing with Wiley Green for the starting job. The Owls did lose their top defensive player LB Blaze Alldredge who transferred to Missouri. On the other side, no Power 5 program in the country has improved more the last two years than Arkansas. The Razorbacks had lost 20 straight SEC games coming into 2020 and also lost non-conference games vs WKU, San Jose St, North Texas and Colorado St. After 3 SEC wins last year under first-year head coach Sam Pittman (Arkansas lost 3 more by a combined 7 points), the Hogs are thinking bowl game in 2021 thanks to 19 returning starters. There's been a lot of Rice money in the marketplace this summer but we disagree and lean with Arkansas and the OVER.

OREGON 42 Fresno St 21. Fresno has the "game under their belt" after destroying a feeble Connecticut team 45-0 last week. Fresno had dominating 25-9 first down and 538-107 yard edges including 7.0-1.8 yards per play. Fresno QB Jake Haener threw for 331 yards but Haener left the game in the second half due to apparent leg cramps as temperatures on the field reached 120 degrees. It looks like he will be good to go here. Be careful betting on teams that already played. Since 2000, teams that have a game under their belt are only 74-87-2 (46%) ATS vs teams playing their season opener (FBS vs FBS). It is better to have game film on your opponent than actually to have played the game. Anthony Brown will get the start at QB for the Ducks. We thought we would be betting the Ducks here but Oregon has three projected starters on defense that won't be playing this game. We'll pass for now.

West Virginia 30 MARYLAND 28. Another sneaky good week one game. West Virginia comes in off a bowl win in year two under Neal Brown and the Mountaineers return 16 starters. While Brown cut his teeth on the offensive side, it was his defense last year that made noise allowing just 20.5 ppg and 291 ypg ranking No. 4 in the country in ypg. That defense does lose two of its best players but should still be among the Big 12's best. On offense, Jarret Doege is back at QB and we really like RB Leddie Brown. Last year the Terps became the first FBS team ever to win back-to-back games outright as an 18-point or more underdog. This year the Terps return 17 starters including QB Taulia Tagovailoa. Their WR corps is the best unit on the team led by Dontay Demus and Rakim Jarrett. It's going to sound like a broken record, but we bet Maryland +4.5 earlier this summer and can't recommend them now at +2.5.

IOWA 24 Indiana 20. You have to give the Big Ten credit for scheduling attractive conference games in week one. This is another between a pair of Top 25 caliber teams. Indiana comes in off an historic season that saw them ranked inside the Top 10 for the first time since 1969. This year's team could be just as good thanks to the return of 17 starters although they did lose a pair of projected starters this summer on offense. QB Michael Penix needs to stay healthy (big question mark). Iowa finished last season with 6 straight wins and were playing like a Top 10 team. Had games vs Michigan and Missouri not been cancelled due to COVID, we're guessing Iowa would be getting more preseason love. Spencer Petras should be better in year 2 as the starting QB and Tyler Goodson is one of the most underrated RB's in the country. The biggest question mark might be at the line of scrimmage as they lose a combined 6 starters on the OL/DL including All-American LT Alaric Jackson and All-American DT Daviyon Nixon. Like a lot of these Big Ten games, this is right near our number.

CINCINNATI 39 Miami, Oh 14. Cincinnati is on a 14-0 straight up (+20.4 ppg) and 9-5 ATS (+5.1 ppg) run vs rival Miami, Oh. Fresh off a 9-1 season that nearly saw them upset Georgia in the Peach Bowl, the Bearcats are easily the best Group of 5 team in the country. They return 14 starters led by QB Desmond Ridder and have a couple of All-Americans candidates on defense in DE Myjai Sanders and CB Ahmad Gardner. Miami, Oh only played 3 games a year ago and the Redhawks return 19 starters. Keep in mind they won the MAC Championship in 2019 and this team looks better at least on paper. Still, we lean with Cincinnati here and already bet them at -19 and -20.5.

Marshall 25 NAVY 24. There's a little bit of unknown here for Marshall who has a new coach in Charles Huff (Alabama RB's coach last year) and the Thundering Herd lost arguably their top 4 players from last year IN RB Brendan Knox, OG Cain Madden, LB Tevante Beckett and DE Darius Hodge. We think they take a step back especially early on in the season. Meanwhile, Navy had a very disappointing 3-7 season a year ago. Remember they didn't practice much tackling prior to the season and paid dearly in the opening 55-3 loss to BYU. This year's team should be improved but they do play the toughest Group of 5 schedule in the country. We lean with Navy here but got them at +3.5 early this summer. A sharp betting group hit them on Monday driving the number off a key "3".

2★ UNDER 61.5 † Alabama 39 Miami, FL 19. Played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, GA. Head coach Nick Saban is 14-0 straight up (+28.9 ppg) and 12-2 ATS (+7.7 ppg) in season openers at Alabama and many of them have come against ranked teams in neutral settings. We're not sure how "neutral" this game is going to be as Alabama is used to playing this building and should have the crowd edge. We gave out the UNDER to VIP customers last week (line has moved 3 points). Here was our reasoning...Miami head coach Manny Diaz is taking over the defensive

play-calling in what we anticipate will be an improved Miami defense this year (UM brings back 9 starters). The Canes allowed 27 ppg a year ago, the most since 2015, a year before Diaz was hired as DC. On the offensive side, we don't anticipate Miami to run QB D'Eriq King much in this game. He's coming off a torn ACL in the bowl and you don't over-use him in a game, you're likely to lose in Week 1. There's way more at stake for the rest of the season. On the other side, we expect Alabama's offense to start slow. Sure, they're talented but the Tide only return 22.3 % of their offensive yards from last year. That ranks No. 129 in the country. They have to replace their top 3 players in QB Mac Jones, RB Najee Harris, WR DeVonta Smith. They also have four new assistants on the offensive side including a new play-caller. In our opinion, Bill O'Brien will be a step down from Sarkisian at least this year. However, on defense Alabama returns 8 starters, their most since 2011. Last year Alabama allowed 19.4 ppg, their most since 2007. We think this year's D will be the best they've had since 2017 when they only allowed 11.9 ppg. We like UNDER.

PITTSBURGH 47 Massachusetts 7. Obviously, UMass has been among the worse in the history of college football the last couple of years. They allowed 52.7 ppg in 2019 and then in 4 games a year ago only averaged 3.0 ppg on offense. They will be improved this year with 15 returning starters. Colorado transfer Tyler Lytle will start at QB. Meanwhile, Pitt has been consistently inconsistent under head coach Pat Narduzzi. Kenny Pickett does return for his 5th year as the starting QB and keep an eye on RB Israel Abanikanda who really impressed us in the spring. The Panthers can name their score here but the line is near our power rating.

MISSOURI 37 Central Michigan 23. We thought head coach Eli Drinkwitz did a very good job getting Missouri to 5-5 a year ago. He's definitely a coach to keep an eye on with his personality and creative play-calling. The Tigers bring back QB Connor Bazelak who completed 67% of his passes last year. They're taking on a Central Michigan team that brings back 20 starters and will be improved after a disappointing 2020 campaign. You're probably getting sick of reading this, but we bet Missouri -11.5 in the summer, it's now -14.5. Obviously, "14" is an important number. Obviously, this isn't a normal week with these lines bet into for several months and we've had our numbers and bets posted in our summer issues for 6-plus weeks.

MISSISSIPPI ST 40 Louisiana Tech 16. A big line move here from the opener that saw BetOnline open Mississippi St -30.5. We ended up getting Louisiana Tech at +28.5 after a few sharp guys beat us to the punch. Louisiana Tech returns 17 starters from last season and should be much improved. They do have a question mark at QB with Luke Anthony coming off injury but they brought in West Virginia transfer Austin Kendall as an insurance policy. Meanwhile, Mississippi St should also be improved in year two under Mike Leach. The Bulldogs started to show signs of life (especially on offense) at the end of last season including winning their final 2 games. One of our favorite totals' bets was OVER 49.5 and we still lean that way.

TEXAS 33 UL-Lafayette 23. Another big line move here that saw UL-Lafayette open as a 14.5-point underdog. Head coach Billy Nappier has this program rolling as they are 21-4 the last two years and this could be his best team yet with 20 returning starters led by QB Levi Lewis. Remember, they went into Iowa St last year and upset the Cyclones in the opener. Meanwhile, Texas has some uncertainty with a new head coach in Steve Sarkisian. We do like the hire and he inherits one of the best RB's in the country in Bijan Robinson. Hudson Card won the starting QB job but it looks like Sark will also play Casey Thompson. This seems like one of those popular public underdogs and while we love our opening ULL bet, we'd lean with Texas at the current number.

USC 38 San Jose St 21. Finally, here's one where we disagree with the line move. First, San Jose St looked pretty good last week as they had a 543-250 yard edge in a 45-14 win over FCS Southern Utah. However, the market tends to overreact to what they just saw and teams with a game under their belt are only 46% ATS vs teams that haven't played (last 20 years). USC head coach Clay Helton is not impressive but the talent disparity is more than this 2-TD spread is indicating. The Trojans return 16 starters and are better on both sides of the ball than a year ago. Fight On!

PURDUE 35 Oregon St 29. Both of these coaches and programs need a solid win. After a great start to his tenure, Purdue head coach Jeff Brohm is just 6-13 straight up in his last 19 games. That's not what Purdue had in mind when they decided to pay Brohm \$6 million a year! This year's team has 17 returning starters and we really like WR David Bell and DE George Karlaftis. The offensive line needs better play and the Boilers need to stay healthy. Meanwhile, Oregon St needs to find a way to win some close games as they have 6 close losses the last two years. Believe it or not, the Beavers have now had 7 straight losing seasons but did notch a huge win over rival Oregon last year. Call us surprised that Colorado transfer Sam Noyer won the starting QB job. Maybe Tristan Gebbia isn't fully healthy yet? We weren't that impressed with Noyer's passing last year. We lean UNDER.

† **Texas Tech 34 Houston 33.** Played at NRG Stadium in Houston, TX. Both coaches are on the hot seat and both need a solid win. As usual with Houston, Dana Holgorsen has a talented team on paper. After seeing many players opt out after 4 games two years ago and then seeing a ton of games cancelled last year, there are no more excuses. Houston is just 7-13 under his watch and Major Applewhite was fired because 7-5/8-4 wasn't good enough. Meanwhile, we're not sure if Matt Wells was a good fit in Lubbock. He has his best team and will see Oregon transfer Tyler Shough start at QB. We weren't that impressed with Shough last year. This is one where we don't see much value in the number but will learn a lot about both teams moving forward.

3★ Baylor 37 TEXAS ST 20. We like Baylor in this match-up. Head coach Dave Aranda was put in a very tough spot last year as a first-time head coach with no spring practice. On top of it, Baylor only had 2 returning starters on defense. This year's defense returns 10 starters and could be one of the best in the Big 12. Keep an eye on NT Api Ika who is 350 pounds and impressed us during the spring. We like some of the skill position talent especially RB Trestan Ebner. Can the Bears get solid QB play? That's the biggest question as Gerry Bohanon will get the start. On the other side, we like the job Jake Spavital is doing despite a 5-19 record the last two years. Texas St was better than their record last year and this will be the best Bobcat team since 2014. Still, the value here is with Baylor. We think the market is overreacting to last year's poor season.

Syracuse 30 OHIO 29. After a break-through 2018 campaign that saw Syracuse win 10 games, the Orange are just 6-17 the last two years and are coming off a dismal 1-10 season. They will be improved with 18 returning starters and will likely play two QB's in Tommy DeVito and Mississippi St transfer Garrett Shrader. Shrader is very similar to Eric Dungey who led that 2018 team in terms of style of play. Meanwhile, Ohio head coach Frank Solich suddenly retired (health concerns) a few months ago after a 16-year run. OC Tim Albin who was with Solich all 16 years was promoted to head coach and has an experienced team with 17 returning starters. The Bobcats did play just 3 games last year and two came against Akron and Bowling Green (two of the worst teams in the country). Our numbers like Ohio here but our gut is telling us Syracuse is the right side. We do like the OVER.

AUBURN 47 Akron 7. Auburn has a new coach in Bryan Harsin and we're not sure if he's that big of an upgrade over Gus Malzahn. With that being said, Malzahn's recruiting left a lot to be desired in recent classes and the Tigers lose their two play-makers at WR in Seth Williams and Anthony Schwartz. RB Tank Bigsby is a stud but will QB Bo Nix finally start to show improvement? They shouldn't have any trouble here vs an Akron program that is 1-22 in their last 23 games. On top of it, Akron lost two of their best players since spring in center Bryce Petersen (transfer) and RB Teon Dollard (legal issues). Auburn can name the score here.

ILLINOIS 29 Utsa 23. This is a dangerous game for Illinois after their upset over Nebraska last week. Illinois starting QB Brandon Peters is likely out for this game. Artur Sitkowski was 12 of 15 with a 2-0 ratio last week and looked much improved from his Rutgers days. They're taking on a UTSA team that surprised many last year going 7-5 under a first-year coach in Jeff Traylor. The Roadrunners return 21 starters led by RB Sincere McCormick who ran for 1,467 yards. The Illini did impress us last week as their defensive line got 5 sacks. Can UTSA hold up at the point of attack? We're passing.

FLORIDA 39 Florida Atlantic 15. We're not huge fans of FAU head coach Willie Taggart but he's got a very experienced team here with 20 returning starters. Miami transfer N'Kosi Perry will get the start at QB and the defense allowed only 17 ppg a year ago. They're stepping way up in class though in playing their first Power 5 team since the 2019 season opener. The Gators lose a lot of skill position talent from last year including QB Kyle Trask, WR Kadarius Toney and the No. 4 overall pick in TE Kyle Pitts. The Gators only return 10 starters and while last year's team was more talented it did finish the season with a dud losing their last 3 games. We do like Emory Jones at QB and the defense should be improved. We're passing.

GEORGIA TECH 38 Northern Illinois 20. We think the Georgia Tech program is heading in the right direction under head coach Geoff Collins. The question is whether the GT faithful will be willing to give him enough time. Moving away from the option takes years of recruiting and on top of it, GT continues to play some of the toughest schedules in the country. This is Collins' best teams and we're excited to see what QB Jeff Sims and RB Jahmyr Gibbs do in their 2nd year. Meanwhile, the NIU program is definitely heading in the wrong direction. From 2010-14, they won at least 11 games every year but haven't topped 8 wins in a season since and are just 5-13 under head coach Thomas Hammock. Last year they were 0-6. They'll have a new QB this year in Michigan St transfer Rocky Lomabardi and do return 18 starters. Still, they are over-matched here. The broken record continues, we laid -13.5 with GT earlier this summer, the line is now -18. We pass.

† **Clemson 28 Georgia 24.** Played at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, NC. This is as good of a Week 1 game as we've ever seen in CFB. Two legit top 5 teams and currently the only game scheduled in this regular season among Top 5 teams. Quite simply, it doesn't get any better. Clemson has to replace QB Trevor Lawrence and RB Travis Etienne but we really like the replacements in DJ Uiagalelei and true frosh Will Shipley. The defense should be nasty with 10 returning starters. On the other side, we think Georgia will have their best offense under head coach Kirby Smart. They were much improved last year when JT Daniels took over at QB. The problem in this game is that their top 2 TE's are out which would have been a match-up nightmare for any defense. Both defensive lines should have their way with the opponents' offensive lines. We do worry about Clemson's offensive line as they were controlled in the first Notre Dame game and the Ohio St game last year. Still, we think they have the better head coach and better QB so they get the edge. We don't think this is a high value game though.

Southern Miss 29 SOUTH ALABAMA 28. These two opened up the season last year with South Alabama pulling the outright upset 32-21 as 12.5-point underdogs. Both teams will look different this year. Southern Miss has their 4th coach in two years. That's not a typo...last year Jay Hopson resigned after the upset loss to South Alabama, then the interim jumped ship a few games later. Will Hall (from Tulane) begins year one and Southern Miss does have 18 returning starters. They'll be improved after their worst season since 2014. On the other side, South Alabama welcomes in Kane Wommack (former Indiana DC). Jake Bentley looks to be the starting QB and the Jags have 16 returning starters. Some money has showed on South Alabama the last 24 hours but we think Southern Miss should be the favorite.

TEXAS A&M 48 Kent St 21. Our numbers say Texas A&M is the right side here but we think Kent St is a very dangerous big underdog. First, the Golden Flashes' offense averaged 50 ppg last year albeit against a weak 4-game MAC slate. This year they return 10 starters on that side of the ball and we really like QB Dustin Crum (32-4 ratio last 2 years). Head coach Sean Lewis will probably get a better job after this season after leading Kent St to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1976-77. That said, we do worry about Kent's poor defense and how it will hold up here. Fresh off their highest finish in the AP poll since 1939, the Aggies remain National Title contenders in 2021. Texas A&M will start Haynes King at QB and we love their RB Isaiah Spiller and TE Jalen Wydermyer. We also think they have a Top 10 defense. We lean OVER.

Lsu 34 UCLA 31. We anticipate this will be the "pros vs joes" game of the week. The public is going to see an SEC team like LSU only laying 3 against a Pac-12 school. They'll lay the points with the Tigers. However, we've seen a ton of professional money already come in on UCLA +4 and +3.5 this week. The Bruins looked good last week in their 44-10 wipe out of Hawaii as we cashed the UNDER as our top play on these pages. LSU is our most improved team in the country but are practicing this week in Houston due to Hurricane Ida. The Tigers will have a

ton of fan support here but it maybe less now after the storm devastated Louisiana. Obviously, the Tigers are the more talented team but UCLA will be better coached. We're sitting this one out for now.

† **Byu 33 Arizona 20.** Played at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas, NV. According to the latest reports, nearly 60,000 tickets have been sold for this one and we expect an overwhelming majority to be BYU fans. We think it's an intriguing game for many reasons. First, BYU only returns 11 starters from last year's 11-1 team. Obviously, they have to replace the No. 2 overall pick in QB Zach Wilson but we like what we saw from Jarren Hall a few years ago and the Cougars top 2 rushers return along with some solid receivers. Meanwhile, Arizona enters on a school-record 12-game losing streak. We like what we've seen so far out of first-year head coach Jedd Fisch but their is a talent deficiency compared to other Power 5 programs. Earlier this spring, we thought we'd be wanting to take Arizona here but we've actually upgraded BYU from our initial ratings and we've seen money come in on them here.

CALIFORNIA 28 Nevada 23. This is another sneaky good game. We think Nevada could have one of the best offenses in the country. QB Carson Strong is a first-round talent at 6-4 215 and he has a very talented WR corps led by Romeo Doubs. Overall, the Wolf Pack return 20 starters from a 7-2 team last year and it's probably the best Nevada team since Kaepernick was behind center more than a decade ago. However, we think the market is giving them their due considering this line is only "3". Cal returns 17 starters and Justin Wilcox has done a solid job here. The Bears offense has not topped 21.5 ppg in each of the last 3 seasons and will need to be improved to keep up with the Wolf Pack here. Still, the Bears' defense remains one of the best in the Pac-12. We actually lean with the home team and bet Cal -2 on an opener. Remember, Nevada's fall camp was moved to Stanford because of the poor air quality in Reno.

SAN DIEGO ST 42 New Mexico St 10. In case you didn't know New Mexico St is really, really bad. If the two performances in the spring vs transitional FCS teams didn't tip you off, last week's 30-3 loss at home to UTEP should have. The Aggies were outgained 452-190 and are ranked No. 130 in our power ratings. If we expanded those ratings to include the FCS, we'd rank New Mexico St as a below average FCS team! With that being said, San Diego St is not the type of team we like laying a huge number with. The Aztecs should be better with 17 returning starters in year 2 under Brady Hoke but their offense hasn't topped 25 ppg in any of the last 3 years. We pass.

WASHINGTON ST 42 Utah St 21. One of our biggest power ratings disparities comes in this game. We think Washington St will be improved in year two under Nick Rolovich. They return 17 starters and we like their RB's Max Borghi and Deon McIntosh. However, there has been a lot of off-field news concerning Rolovich and we wonder if that will have an impact on team chemistry. Speaking of team chemistry, Utah St didn't have any last year with Gary Andersen quitting and the team deciding to not play their final game vs Colorado St. This year they bring in Blake Anderson from Arkansas St and he brought with him Logan Bonner at QB and Justin Rice at LB. The Aggies will be much improved but maybe not as much as the market is making this one out to be. We like Washington St here and lean UNDER.

OKLAHOMA 48 Tulane 18. This game was moved from Tulane to Norman because of Hurricane Ida. The Green Wave have been staying in Birmingham and practicing at Legion Field this week. They return 17 starters including QB Michael Pratt who was solid as a freshman last year (20-8 ratio). They did lose their OC and DC. Meanwhile, Oklahoma has their best team in more than a decade. The improvements have come one the defensive side of the ball as they only allowed 21.7 ppg and 351 ypg last year. QB Spencer Rattler is the Heisman favorite and Lincoln Riley is maybe the best play-caller in CFB. The Sooners can name their score here but the current 31.5 line seems a bit steep.

Sunday, September 5th

Notre Dame 31 FLORIDA ST 23. Another really good opening week game. The Irish are 43-8 the last 4 years but have plenty of question marks this year. They only return 9 starters and will have a new starting QB in Wisconsin transfer Jack Coan. ND does have a great 1-2 punch at RB in Kyren Williams and Chris Tyree and TE Michael Mayer might be the best in the country. Despite losing their top 2 WR's, we think they've upgraded at that position. The biggest question mark will be the offensive line where they've lost 4 starters. ND's defensive front 7 is top 10 caliber but they've recently lost a projected starting LB. On the other side, we think Florida St will be one of the most improved teams in the country. The Seminoles return 16 starters and it will be interesting to see who starts at QB. Will it be McKenzie Milton or Jordan Travis? We expect both to play. We think the strength of the team will be their defensive line which coincides with ND's weakness. This is another great example of betting numbers, not teams. We bet ND -6 at South Point in May and then bet Florida St +10.5 at William Hill in June. The current number of 7.5 feels right to us.

Monday, September 6th

† **Ole Miss 41 Louisville 31.** Played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, GA. We think the Rebels are one of the most underrated teams in the country and can't believe they're not in the AP Top 25 (we have them No. 18). Lane Kiffin's offense will be one of the nation's best led by QB Matt Corral as they return 8 starters from a unit that averaged 39 ppg a year ago. Meanwhile, the defense can only improve after allowing 38 ppg last year (most since 1915). On the other side, we thought we'd be buying Louisville after a dismal 4-7 season a year ago. Another game where we took an early number with Ole Miss -7 but now it's where we lined the game at. We do lean UNDER.

Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 10 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Baylor -13.5**.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.
