I'm am so excited to share our brand new vision statement. As many of you know, I have already begun a sermon series on that very subject.

Just to review – every United Methodist Church shares the same Mission Statement: to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. That is the "what," and it is based on the Great Commission of Matthew 28. However, every church gets to choose "how" they will accomplish the "what." After a year and a half of prayer, deliberation, meditation and more prayer, the Steering Committee recommended our new vision statement to the Church Council. The Church Council spent 2 months hearing about the report of the Steering Committee. In addition, the Church Council prayed over the recommendation. In May of this year, the Church Council unanimously approved the new vision statement.

We believe at First United Methodist Church that we make disciples by welcoming, relating, leading and serving. That is pretty simple – and that is exactly what a vision statement should be. Also, a vision statement is a "now and not yet" sort of thing. We are working in these areas now, but we have not fully grown into each area. We want to achieve excellence in each part of this vision.

These words are formative. By welcoming we mean being intentional about welcoming one another and guests each and every Sunday on several levels – parking lot, curb, door, in the pews and follow-up (we don't want to miss a soul – and we want to reiterate: Everyone is Welcome!) By relating we mean gathering on a regular basis in small groups of 10 to 12 people and focusing on spiritual growth. By Leading, we mean training and resourcing more leaders for ministry. And by serving, we mean offering ministry to meet real needs – physically, mentally and spiritually!

God has given us this vision. It will drive us. It will motivate us. And it will help us to keep the "main thing" the "main thing!" Our vision really is the church looking in the same direction together. When a people are united under God's vision, the sky is the limit. Thanks be to God!
