

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Sunday Advent Year C L

"There is something about Mary!" Those around her pick up on it! We traditionally call today's gospel story scene, 'The Visitation'. John the Baptist leaps in Elizabeth's womb, and Elizabeth herself feels the Holy Spirit move her to recognize within Mary, the long awaited, promised visit of God among His people (Jesus inside Mary's womb). Maybe it would be better to say, *"There is <u>Someone about Mary!"</u>* Yes, it is Jesus within her, but I point out *(Isn't that John's job?)* that there is a forever Unseen Agent driving and behind all of these recognitions. It is the **Holy Spirit!** It all started back that the visit of the Angel Gabriel to Mary in Luke 1:35, when Gabriel announced that "The *Holy Spirit* will come upon you..." Then the Spirit continues to act when Luke 1:41 tells us that "Elizabeth, filled with the *holy Spirit*" recognizes Mary's special role as Mother of God. Of course, within the waters of Elizabeth's womb, the Spirit had been moving Little John too, as Agnel Gabriel had told Zechariah, "the child {John} will be filled with the *holy Spirit* even from his mother's womb" (Luke 1:15). And though initially doubting, even Zechariah comes around later to finally realize that God's Spirit is at work in events, when Luke 1:67 tells us that "Zechariah his father, filled with the *holy Spirit*, prophesied...."

I am always amazed at the intimately personal encounter between Elizabeth and Mary, both for its wonderful example of peer-to-peer ministry (Mary and Elizabeth understand best what the other person feels and is going through as they go through it together!), but also for Elizabeth's insightful discernment of Mary's role as Mother of our Savior. The Angel Gabirel had declared Mary to be "full of grace: Lord is with you.' (Luke 1:18). Yet, Elizabeth herself recognizes and announces Mary's unique blessing when she declares, "Most blessed are you among women and *blessed* is the fruit of your womb" in (Luke 1:42). Elizabeth completes a trifecta recognition of blessing in Mary, when she further adds, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled" (Luke 1:45). The Magnificat prayer of Mary praising God for the wonders of His grace is a wonderful summary of our Catholic belief in the singularly unique role of Mary among all humankind. Mary begins her prayer by acknowledging her servanthood and dependence upon God, when she says, "her soul proclaims the greatness of Godfor looking upon his handmaid's lowliness..." (1:46-8). She adds that she rejoices in God's glory because "from now on will all ages call me blessed." (Luke 1:48) All ages (right now we do!) do call her Blessed every time we utter a Hail Mary prayer. We repeat that line from both Gabriel and Elizabeth that Mary has been 'blessed' by God. So, yes we fulfill prophecy every time we pray the words of the Hail Mary. The first half of the Hail Mary, is in fact, scripture quotes strung together. And the second half of the prayer simply asks Mary to pray for us (of course *now* and at the hour of our most need-death!). Who wouldn't ask anyone, everyone, to pray for them-we may say that those who pass from this earth are dead but they are still alive in Christ? In Christ, believers are One! So, yes we praise God's wonders in allowing a simple servant disciple Mary to become the Mother of His Son-our Savior! Sometimes we Catholics get accused of focusing too much attention on Mary – even though everyone pulls out their statues of Mary in how many Nativity Scenes around the world at Christmas (It's just that we keep Mary out all year long-to not forget how God works through us human vessels-like her). But lest we think it is too much attention on any one human being, please keep in mind that Mary is so humble, that she always deflects and redirects any attention given her, she directs it toward Her Son - Jesus (Notice how in those same Nativity Scenes, everyone's eyes are pointed toward the crib, especially Mary's downward glance to Him*she wants the attention and praise to be directed to the center – the crib of Christ!*)

So it is with Mary! She is humble servant of Jesus. As she herself said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). Mary is always at Jesus' side, from His crib to His cross. Keep in mind that Mary's last words (like John the Baptist who also, always points us to Christ!) recorded in the gospel are at the wedding at Cana, when Mary advised us to "Do whatever He tell you!" (John 2:5). Mary's humility is her lesson to us. She is the model disciple, most faithful and always serving. There is something about her! Peace, Fr Brian
