As of 3-30-2011 The Hutch News will begin charging for viewing
the online version of news. They will allow you 10 articles/month
then you will have to subscribe.

'Some links on The News' site will remain free, such as access to breaking news and wire service reports. Niche websites of The News, including www.justpreps.com & www.kansasagland.com, also will remain free.

The price for full access to the Web will be \$9.75 a month, compared to \$14.35 a month, before taxes, for home delivery of the newspaper within the city limits of Hutchinson. Those who already are print newspaper subscribers can get access to the Web edition for an extra \$1.95 a month.'

The four top floors are each composed of a single studio apartment, single one-bedroom apartment and two apartments each of two and three bedrooms.

The ground floor includes single studio, one-bedroom and two-bedroom apartments that are completely ADA-compliant, with lower counters and switches and bathroom accommodations. That floor also has another studio and one-bedroom apartment that are more standard but have roll-in showers.

Colors for each apartment and hallways are all the same, primarily in tans and browns, and each apartment boasts the same amenities. Those include a full-size refrigerator, electric range and oven, microwave oven, dishwasher, garbage disposal, and ceiling fans in every room.

Each apartment also has its own heating and air conditioning unit and wall thermostat. Each floor also has a laundry room, with a pair of washers and dryers.

The apartments otherwise are not furnished.

All the apartments are income-restricted, Gonzales said, meaning tenants must meet qualifying income levels to get in. Eligible household incomes range from \$14,800 to \$36,780. Rents are subsidized and range from \$250 per month for a studio apartment to \$435 for a threebedroom. (and lots of other amenities - See full article)
