ONE completed Crayon Challenge Quilt came in at our May meeting! I think you can see all of them on our Facebook page, thanks to Rachel Riley! This means there are 31 of us (me included!) who have just one more meeting (June!) before our deadline at our July 31 meeting and I know who you are!!! Proceeds from the Silent Auction at our Quilt Show will go to All Saints Foundation for the Mental Health and Addiction Program at the Wisconsin Avenue site. This is the ONLY inpatient care center in Racine and Kenosha serving about 6,500 patients a year. Plus, this program is one of the few in the state that accepts Medicaid.

There are many publicity "puzzle pieces" which will promote a successful quilt show in October. It is very important that ALL LHQG members take an active role by selling raffle tickets and distributing bookmarks, placing yard signs (coming later in the summer), liking the Guild on Facebook, taking posters and bookmarks to shops and guilds, entering quilts and encouraging others to do so, talking, talking, talking about the show!

We have made contact with the editor/writer/publisher of Belle City Hometown Magazine. Katie Matteson plans to attend our June meeting to interview, photograph, learn about our guild. 
