Guild Meeting Minutes

October 30, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM. There were seven visitors at the meeting who went to the quilt show and came to see what our guild was all about.

Regina Scott Brooks announced our annual school house meeting where we have guild members present a technique used in quilting. She talked to members who are attending the meeting via Zoom, saying we are doing our best for our members who cannot attend in person, but there have been internet issues and we are trying to resolve them. She apologized to the people who were not able to see last month's meeting on Zoom because the internet kept shutting down.

Regina introduced the three presenters for the night. Judy Martin showed her cotton hand applique technique and showed us several beautiful quilts she had made. She also handed out her notes on hand applique. Autumn Latimore showed her wool hand applique technique and gave several pointers on thread, needles, and the difference between wool felt and felted wool. Vickie Madsen showed us an amazing upholstered folding chair and explained to us how she made the cover.

Pat Henningfeld asked Cecilia Johnson, our quilt show treasurer, to come up. Cecilia talked about why we have a show, how everyone in the guild has to work together to accomplish it, what works and what doesn't work. The raffle quilt made \$2,600; Boutique \$2,200; Raffle Baskets \$1,500; crayon challenge \$1,500; admissions \$3,000. After expenses, the profit was approximately \$4,000.

Autumn Latimore talked about the Holiday Party that will be on November 27th at the Reefpoint Brew House. The cost is \$25. There will be a cash bar. The time is 5:30 for drinks and socializing, dinner will be at 6:30. There will be door prizes. Instead of bringing food items for the Food Pantry, members are asked to bring cash or checks. Checks should be made out to "Racine Food Pantry." Discussion was had about the Tiny Homes for veterans, and whether or not the guild wants to direct donations to the Tiny Homes Marketplace next year. There was a motion to direct May and November cash to the Tiny Homes, then amended to May and October. It was decided not to make a formal motion at this meeting and we will re-visit this subject in January.

Nancy Larsen was called up to talk about the Holiday Raffle Quilt which was on display in the back of the room. Nancy Larsen, Mary Risler and Darlene Krueger made the quilt. Debbie Blaustein did the quilting. Tickets were in last month's newsletter and will also be in November newsletter. Only guild members can buy the tickets, which are one for \$2.00 or three for \$5.00. Tickets will also be sold at the Holiday party.

The new board members were introduced.

Regina said the Then and Now presentation will be at the January meeting, where members show several of their quilts to the guild from their first to their last and most current. Regina is looking for two more volunteers. She said we will need school house volunteers for next year. Regina is also looking to have a conversation with members about where they quilt. Please contact her if you're interested in participating in January's Then and Now, if you've got a skill you'd like to demonstrate at next year's school house presentation, or if you'd like to talk to her about where you quilt.

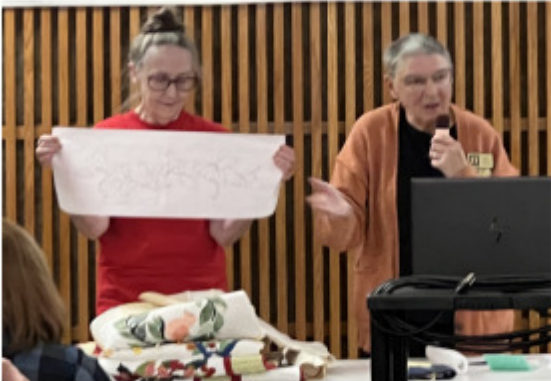
Regina also talked about making quilts for the Tiny House vets. The quilts will be for the vets, not the Tiny House they live in, and they will take the quilt with them when they leave the Tiny House. There are currently 12 houses that are occupied by eleven men and one woman.

Show and Tell included charity quilts for the vets that Regina collected.

Quilt Show Wrap Up

Lighthouse Legacies 23 was a huge success!

Thanks to the committee who worked tirelessly for more than a year and then three or more intense days. Thanks to all who created gorgeous quilts for us to showcase, those who donated items for the boutique, raffle, and crayon challenge, the vendors who supported us, the creators and marketers of the raffle quilt, and all of you who volunteered before, during and after the show—and some of you brought friends, family and husbands to help, too

Thank you!!!! **Mary Wolter and Kitty Friend, co chairs**

Entries, TC Wiley, Chair - This year we had 226 entries but after quilt check in, the number fell to 219 entries. Most of the quilts come from the Midwest. The Best of Show came from Virginia; several other entries came from Colorado.

Quilt Show Treasurer, Cecilia Johnson - I am busy from booking until the last bank statement for the show is finalized including all payments for receipts or bills submitted. Prize money is awarded in all 89 categories. After all the expenses, Lighthouse Legacies made a little more than \$4000!!!

Volunteers, Jean Veltman, Chair - 102 Volunteers in 225 shifts!! It was so wonderful on the day of the show, as people came to me and said (for example), "I'm available from 11-1:30 if you need anyone to fill in". I had NO no-shows and everything was well covered. LHQ you were AWESOME in supporting the quilt show.

Judging, Vicki Madsen, Chair - Thanks to all who donated time and energy to the judging process. This takes about 20 people for a day and half of fun, some physical work, (quilts get heavy) and time to make some new friends. WE GET TO TOUCH EVERY ITEM IN OUR SHOW. Our group moves, folds and refolds each quilt at least 5 times. We get to hear the judges comments up close and learn tips to improve our quilts.

Raffle, Sue Causey, Chair - Thank you to all who donated items for our first time raffle! I was thrilled at the generosity and creativity of all of you. We had more than 65 items donated which gave us 35 raffle items—everything from puzzles, fabric, wine, yarn notions, cooking/baking items, quilt kits, and more plus tickets, index cards, tables and cloths, and baskets! The raffle brought in about \$1500!!! Special thanks to my team—Leslie Fellion, Ellen Harrison, Phyllis Stengel, Laura Sanders and Joy Hay.

Quilt Show Set-up committee, Cecilia and Ray Johnson, chairs - We start early to clean and repair the racks in storage, arrange for delivery and pick up, set up the poles at the hall according to measurements on the lay out grid map on Thursday (3 hours with 11 volunteers), orient volunteers to hang the quilts delivered on Friday by the judging committee (4 hours with 30 volunteers), collect pillowcases for distribution on Sunday, help orient the take-down volunteers that dismantle the quilts for check out (approx. 1 hour with 24 volunteers), disassemble the racks for pick up and storage (2 hours with 6 volunteers). Thanks to all who volunteered!

Quilt Show Wrap Up, page 2

Concessions, Grace Kragness, Chair Thanks to the many volunteers who made table centerpieces, helped with organization and set up/take down of the concession area. We served two kinds of sandwiches, hot ham on bun and chicken salad on a croissant, chips. Cookies, soda, water and coffee.

Boutique, Yvonne Parks, Chair – Thanks to all who created and donated items to the Boutique. We had more than 600 items and sales of about \$2200! We have a few items left which will be sold elsewhere or will be held over until our next show in 2025.

Ribbons, Mary Bielefeldt, Chair I created, embroidered and sewed 120 ribbons—all by myself. Next time, I would like a co-chair!!!!

Crayon Challenge, Barbara Vallone, Chair – Thanks to all who made and those who purchased crayon quilts! We had 40 colorful quilts and were able to make a \$1267 donation to Bethany House. Thanks, also, to all the crayon challenge volunteers!

Kathy Lijewski, Raffle Quilt, Chair – Thanks to Sew and Save for donating the printing of the tickets! And thanks to all members who sold their allotted 25 tickets. All of those sales plus the sales during the show contributed about \$2600 to the guild.
