Early bird registration is due one month prior to the beginning of each camp. After this date, fees are \$25 more. We suggest you request funding by June 1 to ensure time for early registration.

Participants in Sharing God's Love

Isn't it wonderful and amazing that in spite of who we are God loves us! God doesn't just love us when we get our spiritual lives all tidied up. He doesn't just love us when we get things figured out. God brings us into His love. We may think that we are outside His boundary or that our sins are too big for God to handle. Not so! God loves us and meets us at our point of need, and He enables us to be part of His plan to bring love into this world.

Because God is love, we can love. God's Word tells us that we are not only to "love in word or talk but in deed and in truth" (1 John 3:18). The love that God has for us should prompt us to go out into this world to share love through our words and deeds. The Apostle John tells us that we are to love one another "just as He has commanded us" (1 John 3:23).

Loving others is challenging because some people seem impossible to love. We may ask, "Do I have to love him or her?" We should not be surprised that there are many moments and days when we ourselves are not so loveable. We can be hard to love.

In Genesis 1, we are told that God created man in His image. Even though that image was lost, God still seeks us. He knows that we are sinners and don't love as we should; that is why He sent His Son into this world. The love of God is found in Jesus. From the Apostle John we read, "By this we know love, that He laid down His life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers" (1 John 3:16). God's love is revealed in the flesh and blood of Jesus. In the same way, Jesus wants us to use our lives—to lay down our lives—that our brothers and sisters might be blessed and saved. Through faith, we are able to love others because "love is from God" (1 John 4:7).

Filled with God's love, we are prompted to share our time and financial resources with others. With all the blessings that God gives to us, we have the opportunity to share with others. Our blessings are to be used to help our neighbors in need. In John's words, "But, if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?" (1 John 3:17). May God's love within us overflow through us to others.

From Pastor's Desk

1 Corinthians 15:55 "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?"

These words at the end of St. Paul's magnificent chapter on the resurrection of the body in 1 Corinthians 15, are words that change everything. Good Friday for the disciples ended all hope; Jesus was dead! And if Jesus was dead, God was dead. There's absolutely no hope, no peace when God is dead. The tomb is shut. Death won! If this is the end, the world would be stuck in endless death, darkness, and dread.

Anyone who has ever buried a loved one knows the heart-wrenching agony of death. It's a loss that cannot be defined. A pain and void that cannot be healed. Death is bad. It's finality brings darkness and dread unmatched by anything in creation.

But something happened that no one expected. The women went to the tomb to continue the embalming process of their Lord and found the stone rolled away. The angels inside the tomb told of an unimagined surprise: Jesus is risen! He's alive! And if Jesus is risen, death is conquered! (Matthew 28:6)

Indeed, Jesus is risen! There are no sweeter words in all of language! Jesus is risen! Because of that, Christians have hope and peace and comfort beyond anything we experience. Not even death can destroy our joy, because we know death is not the end. In the face of death we say with St. Paul: "O death were is your victory!" In other words, death has lost; Christ has won the victory! And this the reality on which our faith rests: Alleluia! Christ is risen!

May the peace of the risen Jesus be yours, not only at Easter, but every day!


