May our faith be certain. May it be founded on the Word of God; on deep knowledge of the Gospel message, and especially of the life, person and work of Christ, and also on the interior witness of the holy spirit."

Two presentations regarding end of life:

Redefining Palliative Care for the 21st Century with Pamela Mansfield, MD, Palliative Care Division Head, Moncton Hospital, Horizon Health Network, and Assistant Professor, Dalhousie University takes place on Saturday, October 19th from 9:30 a.m. to noon at St. Bernard's Church Hall. Dr. Mansfield will help us understand that Palliative Care is for anyone with a life limiting illness; explain what we can do to help someone with a life limiting illness; and discuss what leads to the request for medical assistance in dying.

End of Life Issues and Estate Planning: Thinking Outside the Box with Eileen Dennis, B.A., LL.B. a lawyer specializing in family, property and estate law, takes place on Thursday, October 24th from 6:30-8:30 p.m., also at St. Bernard's Church Hall. Ms. Dennis will help us to understand what Advance Care Planning is and the importance of it; speak about the need to have conversations with loved ones to ensure our end of life decisions are respected; and explain what should be in the will, and what should be clarified beforehand.

Both sessions take place at St. Bernard's Church hall. Pre-registration for one or both sessions is necessary and may be done by contacting Ellen.
