**OCTOBER - MONTH OF THE ROSARY**

On September 29, 2018, Pope Francis asked all Catholics to pray the rosary daily during the month of October, asking Mary and St. Michael the Archangel to intercede for the protection of the Church in this moment of "spiritual turbulence," and to invoke Mary's intercession, placing the Church under her "protective mantle". The statement also encouraged the praying of Sub Tuum Praesidium: "We fly to Thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin."

The prayers of repentance and healing in the wake of the abuse findings of the Pennsylvania Grand Jury as requested by Archbishop Sartain will continue to be prayed throughout the Archdiocese of Seattle through this coming week and concluding with the weekend Masses on October 13/14.

The Novena will be prayed from 6-7:00 pm each night at St. Mary's in the church and after the weekend masses. All are encouraged to join either at church or in your homes.

The Novena Prayers will be available at the Narthex.

The purpose of the Novena is to pray for all the victims of clergy sexual abuse, ask forgiveness for the sins of action and inaction on the part of the Church leaders, and to pray for the renewal the Church needs to protect the vulnerable and proclaim Christ's Gospel with transparency and integrity.

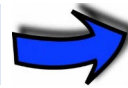

**To Choose in Accord With Conscience**

§1786-1789

Faced with a moral choice, conscience can make either a right judgement in accordance with reason and the divine law or, on the contrary, an erroneous judgement that departs from them.

Man is sometimes confronted by situations that make moral judgement less assured and decision difficult. But he must always seriously seek what is right and good and discern the will of God expressed in divine law.

To this purpose, man strives to interpret the data of experience and the signs of the times assisted by the virtue of prudence, by the advice of competent people, and by the help of the Holy Spirit and his gifts.

Some rules apply in every case:

---one may never do evil so that good may result from it;

---the Golden Rule: "Whatever you wish that men would do to you, so do to them."

---charity always proceeds by way of respect for one's neighbor and his conscience: "Thus sinning against your brethren and wounding their conscience...you sin against Christ." Therefore "it is right not to...do anything that makes your brother stumble."

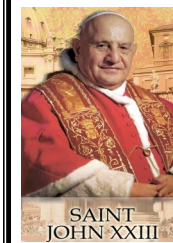
**A HELPING HAND NEEDED**

**POPE SAINT JOHN XXIII  
Feast Day October 11**

Cardinal Angelo Roncalli became the remarkable, if controversial, Pope Saint John XXIII. His fellow Cardinals elected him as a stop-gap Pope to give them time to get the politics ironed out for a more permanent candidate. Little did they know what the Holy Spirit had in store for the Church through this "temporary" Pope. Few people had as great an impact on the 20th century as Pope John XXIII yet this "ordinary" man opened the windows of the Vatican and initiated dialogue with many other faiths. At the Second Vatican Council which was perhaps the greatest hallmark of his pontificate he criticized the "prophets of doom and ruin in the Church," but went on saying that, "The Church has always opposed errors...but the Spouse of Christ prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than that of severity." He died four and a half years after his election.
