Purpose: To make improvements in disclosures to the public about candidates for elected federal office.

In the House of Representatives

The Federal Qualifications Act of 2024

Section 1

Any person applying for an elected federal office in the United States, in addition to all current requirements, must provide the federal government unfettered access to the following:

- 1. All academic records from all schools without any redactions.
- 2. All employment records without redactions unless declared highly classified by the Supreme Court.
- 3. All health records for the last five years without redactions.
- 4. All military records without redactions.
- 5. An original copy of applicant's birth certificate or federal, legally acceptable substitute.
- 6. The results of a complete medical examination conducted at Walter Reed Hospital by its staff within three months prior to this application.
- 7. The original video tape of the administering by the current Surgeon General of the United States of a standard mental cognitive test approved by the National Institute of aging. Only one test may be administered to each applicant.

Section 2

Applicant must supply a written, certified document stating that applicant will not run for any federal office after completing eighteen years of elected federal service. An allowed exception: candidate may run anytime for president or vice-president and/or may be appointed to any federal position. Applicant further agrees to waive any "right to privacy" rights pertaining to the information requested above.

Section 3

The federal government shall make these records publicly available to anyone without cost through the Freedom of Information Act as well as being published on a federal government-maintained website visible to the general public.

Section 4

Any person unwilling to provide any of the information requested in Section 1 may not run for any elected federal office.
