This Board of Directors Meeting and social gathering of Dragon Run Saddle Club was held on 1/9/20, from 7-10pm, at the Smith's home in Gloucester Courthouse, VA.

BOD Members present: President Angie Leigh, Vice President Shelley Eldridge, Secretary/Treasurer Valerie Brown, Event Coordinator Jennifer Smith, Member At Large Denise Walker. (all present)

First item on agenda; 2020 Calendar:

Meetings

-Will continue to be held every 2nd Thursday of each month. Any cancellations or changes will be shared as soon as possible via email, facebook chat group, and facebook page.

-Location. We will continue to hold general meetings at New Quarter Farm in the warm months as a potluck, and a restaurant suitable* for meeting purposes in Gloucester Courthouse during the cold months. This seems to be a reasonable compromise for those wanting the meeting at the same location each month and those wanting the meeting at a different location each month; as well as those wanting potlucks and those wanting restaurants.

(Suitable location - our meetings require enough space to seat 12-18 people at a single table, be competitively priced, and in an area of the building separate enough from other diners to facilitate members hearing a speaker over ambient noise.)

-Our December meeting and annual Holiday Party remains the Saturday evening after Christmas and will return to the Smith's home.

-Meeting raffle. We will return to having a prize raffle at each meeting in 2020. MAL Denise Walker has volunteered to take on this task. Items can be donated, if no donation, \$15 spending limit from our treasury.

-Guest speakers. BOD goal is to have 2-3 guest speakers at meetings this year. Topics proposed are: pasture management, yoga for riders, acupuncture, joint replacements/aging and aging horse needs.

Trail Workdays

-Trail work days are needed just prior to each fundraiser event to ensure the trail is clear, to decorate/set up, and ensure markings are in place. In attempts to accommodate both those members that work on Saturdays and those that attend church on Sunday, we rotate days as much as possible. These workdays are detrimental to our club's fundraising abilities, future and reflective of our mission/goals.

-Beaverdam trail work days are for the purpose of maintaining and improving our only public riding trails in Gloucester County. These days have specific goals and frequently require specialized equipment, operators, and land access permissions; days are in accordance to availability of these assets that we are very fortunate to have the donations of their use and/or time. Objectives for these workdays are pre arranged and must be approved by park management.

Fundraiser (Club) Events

Our fundraisers are just that, they bring in revenue, through our club mission of trail riding, to fund club expenses and donations associated. - *Discussion - BOD is in agreement club events should be in accordance with our club mission/goals/purpose.

4. Calendar/Notifications

- one member request for more advance notice on meetings and happenings
- *Discussion - DRSC BOD meets the first of January every calendar year for the purpose of setting events for the entire calendar year. These events are posted very shortly after on our club website and remain there for the entirety of that calendar year. Regrettably, weather and other unforeseen events require the cancellation or rescheduling of our Events. These decisions are never made flippantly. When the need to reschedule/cancel has occurred, notice has been given to members within minutes of the decision through email, facebook, phone calls and text messages. The BOD will continue this procedure and encourages members to check the calendar page on the DRSC website, FB page, FB group, and email with some frequency.

5. Day of the week events are held.

- one member request to not hold events on Sunday due to clash with church attendance.
- *Discussion - Days of the week(end) are chosen by availability of location, volunteers, tasks, and equipment. Example: Beaverdam workdays frequently utilize private land crossing that is hunted on Saturdays, therefore during hunting season those workdays must be on Sunday. Second example: Location for event is being utilized another purpose for on their regular workday of Saturday is only available to us on Sunday. The BOD does make every effort to divide the events dates between Saturday and Sunday as much as possible.

6. Incentive programs - awards changes

- *Discussion - the BOD is open to suggestions and changes that are able to fulfill the same needs at the same costs as the current awards. Please submit suggestions for the 2021 calendar year.

7. Incentive programs - forms

- one member request for club to provide forms/chart to assist members
- *Discussion - with so many different technology mediums and members understanding and access to them this is very difficult to achieve paperless. Returning to the previous "on paper" format slows the process down considerably for everyone. Efforts will be made to clarify/simplify/explain the gathering of this information and published on the year's information sheet on the Incentive Programs.

Miles in the Saddle

Keep track of your hours or miles in the saddle, the location, and date. At the end of each month email this information to DRSCIncentivePrograms@yahoo.com Hours in the saddle will be converted to miles at the rate of 4mph. **Strategy note: an average non-gaited horse walks 3mph, our rate of 4mph is based on a rider that usually walks and only trots every now and again to equal that average speed of 4mph. If you ride than that, you'll get more credit for your riding by using a GPS or an App for your phone. (information on phone apps is in the January Newsletter)* If you use an app, just screenshot your monthly summary and email that.

Volunteer Hours

Keep track of the time you spend working on DRSC events, local trails, and/or representing our club at functions. Email DragonRunSaddleClub@yahoo.com at the end of each month with the following information: time spent, activities performed, location of activity, and purpose of activity.

The Fine Print

Incentive programs run from January 15th or when you join the club to December 15th. *(Example: You renew or join the club on January 2nd, you start counting on January 15th; if you don't renew until May 5th, you start counting on May 5th - any riding/volunteer time from Jan 15th to May 5th is forfeited.)* As this is a new policy, there is a grace period until February 15, 2020 to turn in dues/registration. So start counting your saddle time/miles and volunteer hours on January 15th and get your dues/registration in ASAP.

Incentive programs are meant to encourage and reward members through healthy competition, both; between members and to challenge yourself to meet goals. Please utilize the honor system in reporting your updates. Event Coordinator will keep log for all programs. Programs close promptly on December 15th and all results must be received by that date. Final results and awards will be presented at the yearly Holiday Party.

Trail News

It's time to renew your park passes!

Beaverdam - still free! No passes required. They request we keep the parking area clear of manure and place our coggins on the dash when riding.

York River State Park - Several options. #1 Pay-as-you-go, \$3 per trailer up to 2 horses, add \$2 for each additional horse. #2 Yearly pass to (just) this park, called "Naturally Yours Passport" for \$66 or \$36 for Seniors (over 62yo). (Quick math, that's 22 trips at the "pay-as-you-go-rate.") #3 "Naturally Yours Passport: ALL PARKS" for \$167 or \$133 for Seniors, this covers parking at all state parks (for your trailer & two horses). The following 21 parks have equestrian trails: Grayson Highlands State Park, New River Trail State Park, Bear Creek Lake State Park, High Bridge Trail State Park, Holliday Lake State Park, James River State Park, Pocahontas State Park, Powhatan State Park, Twin Lakes State Park, Belle Isle State Park, Chippokes Plantation State Park, York River State Park, Breaks Interstate Park, Wilderness Road State Park, Lake Anna State Park, Shenandoah River State Park, Sky Meadows State Park, Fairy Stone State Park, Occoneechee State Park, Staunton River State Park, Douthat State Park.

Newport News Park - free! If you park in the park, currently the only parking available is at the show ring (no trails access) or at the boat ramp (off Jefferson Ave).

Yorktown Battlefield - this is where most of us park to utilize Newport News Park trails. The park at Surrender Field you do need a Colonial National Historical Park pass. It's \$10 a day or \$40 a year. There's another option here too, the America the Beautiful National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Annual Pass, at \$80. (for Seniors, that's \$80 is for life!) This pass includes admittance/parking/use of over 2,000 US parks, on the mainland, USVI, and Hawaii. The following parks are in VA: Great Falls Park, Appomattox Court House Historical Park, Assateague Island National Seashore, Back Bay NWR, Chincoteague NWR, Colonial National Historical Park Yorktown, Colonial National Historical Park, Eastern Virginia Rivers NWR Complex, George Washington & Jefferson National Forest, Great Dismal Swamp NWR, Great Falls Park, John H. Kerr Dam and Reservoir, John W. Flannagan Dam, Lower Potomac BLM Field Station, Maggie L. Walker National Historic Site, Occoquan Bay NWR, Petersburg National Battlefield, Philpott Lake, Prince William Forest Park, Richmond National Battlefield Park, Shenandoah National Park - Front Royal Entrance, Shenandoah National Park - Rockfish Entrance Afton, Shenandoah National Park - Swift Run Entrance Elkton, Shenandoah National Park - Thornton Gap Entrance Luray, Washington & Jefferson NF Norton, Washington & Jefferson NF - Eastern Divide District Blacksburg, Washington & Jefferson NF - Glenwood/Pedlar Districts Station, Washington & Jefferson NF - James River District Covington, Washington & Jefferson NF - Lee District Edinburg, Washington & Jefferson NF - Mount Rogers NRA Marion, Washington & Jefferson NF - North River District Harrisonburg, Washington & Jefferson NF - Warm Springs District Hot Springs.

Sandy Point State Forest - You need a state forest permit at \$16 per year. It also gives you access to the following: Appomattox-Buckingham State Forest, Big Woods State Forest, Bourassa State Forest, Browne State Forest, Channels State Forest, Chesterfield State Forest, Chilton Woods State Forest, Conway Robinson State Forest, Crawfords State Forest, Cumberland State Forest, Devil's Backbone State Forest, Dragon Run

State Forest, Hawks State Forest, Lesesne State Forest, Matthews State Forest, Moore's Creek State Forest, Niday Place State Forest, Old Flat State Forest, Paul State Forest, Prince Edward-Gallion State Forest, South Quay State Forest, Whitney State Forest, Zoar State Forest.

*Hint: The State Park passes cover your rig and up to two horses. The Federal Park passes covers your rig and up to four horses. Get with your best riding buddy, one buy one pass, one buy the other - you're both covered! ;)

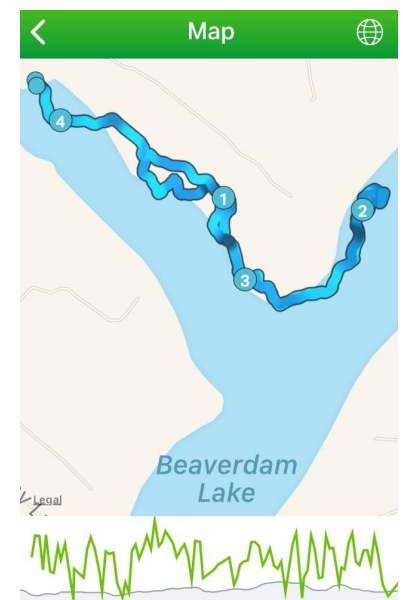
