LET OUR DRIVE BEGIN!!!

It is with much excitement that we

launch this year's ANNUAL WISH LIST DRIVE for the LOS ANGELES RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE! Every year at this time,

our club reaches



out into the community to help those less fortunate than ourselves. In recent years, Trail Dusters and Rail Dusters have supported RMH and have done so in a variety of ways.

We started out donating toys for the children there, but have since expanded our efforts to supplying food for the two pantries that are open to the residents 24/7, as well as dishes, pots & pans and small appliances for the kitchens, even vacuum cleaners, and last year, we turned over 75 sets of queen size bed linens and bathroom towel sets that were badly needed. In the past, our club also built a Children's Library at the House and furnished it with books written in many languages since the children come here from a multitude of countries.

For you who may not be familiar with the Ronald McDonald House, this is a "home away from home" for countless families who come from around the world seeking medical help for their critically ill children (from newborn to age 18 years,); as help is not available where they reside.

The LA House is located just one block from Children's Hospital where the majority of the children go for treatment. Some patients are hospitalized full time, while others may undergo treatment daily or several times a week, and then they return to RMH to be with their families. There are two houses that comprise the LA House, with 75 cozy apartments in all. Some families stay for just a short time while others may reside there for as much as two years. Families are asked to pay just \$25 per night IF they can, but no one is turned away if they are unable to pay. Most of the time, the House is filled to capacity with many more on a waiting list. The children who come here are all afflicted with lifethreatening illnesses and need to be near their parents. Each House includes, in addition to the private apartments, a large community kitchen where families prepare their meals and generally eat together. There are self service laundry facilities at every level in each House, there are game rooms, computer rooms and more - all serving to create a warm. and comfortable inviting atmosphere for the families while they're away from home.



This year, we've learned that the ice machine in the newer of the two Houses is no longer working. This is an item that is

used each and every day. The cost for such a machine (after much research by RMH and by us,) is just about \$2,000. Our first goal is to replace that broken down machine with a new one-much to the delight of the RMH staff!

Additionally, they are in need of minirefrigerators to be used on loan to individual apartments. We expect to be able to prov



be able to provide a good number

of these as well. Instead of just donating the cash to RMH and having them purchase the large items (which would be going to their Los Angeles address,) we have arranged to make those purchases ourselves (as your Drive Chairpersons) since we reside in Ventura County. In this way, we're able to save quite a bit of money on the tax (since tax is based upon where the item is being delivered!) We can purchase a large amount of much needed breakfast bars for their pantries just with the savings!

With YOUR help – and that means Trail/Rail Dusters EVERYONE, can once again make a HUGE difference in the quality of life for the residents of the LA Ronald McDonald House. Your donations are badly needed and will be greatly appreciated - NO MATTER WHAT THE AMOUNT! You can make a cash donation or write a CHECK made out to us - NORM KAMAN (since we are making all the purchases,) and you can write on the lower left corner of your check, "Donation to LA RMH."

Our Drive is now in full swing and we need YOUR support. We will be at every class and will gratefully accept whatever you are able to contribute.
