Scholarship Report

The KJCC Scholarship Committee has implemented two types of financial awards available to children of KJCC members who are Monroe County full-time residents upon graduation from high school or secondary school.

The first is the Pauline and Al Roller Merit Award. The amount for the award of \$500 or \$1000 will be based upon an assessment by the Scholarship Committee. This will include the recipient's grade point average (GPA), extracurricular activities, SAT test scores, community service and other intangible information.

The second award is the KJCC Scholarship Award. The maximum amount of Scholarship is \$2,500 per year, per student. Financial need will be determined by the Scholarship Committee. The money is to be used for post high school education and not limited to a college or university. Applicant must have a GPA of 2.5 or higher, community service hours and submit an essay outlining future academic goals. The application for scholarship aid deadline is April 15.

Today Bubbe is featuring a trio of recipes by one of our well-known cooks. Nettie always brings a requested dish to our Shabbat Dinners, and here are some of her favorites.

TAKE A BOX OF BISQUICK

BANANA NUT BREAD

What to do with a few over ripe bananas

2 1/3 c bisquick

3 eggs

1 c sugar

1 t vanilla

3 to 4 large bananas

1/3 c oil

Nuts, raisins, or chocolate chips as desired - about one cup. In a large bowl, mix everything well. Pour into a greased and floured pan and bake at 350° for 55 minutes to an hour until done.

BISQUICK QUICHE

1 c bisquick

1 chopped onion

1/4 c oil

salt & pepper to taste

3 cs chopped zucchini

4 eggs

1/4 to 1/2 c grated cheese

Parsley and marjoram

In a large bowl, mix all the ingredients well. Pour into a greased quiche or pie pan and bake 30 to 35 min at 350°. Want individual snacks? Bake in muffin tins about 30 min. For a double batch, bake in a 9 by 11 pan about 40 minutes.

Try other veggies such as yellow squash, frozen broccoli (20 oz bag), spinach (2 - 10 oz boxes drained well). Use eggbeaters or egg whites to equal 4 eggs. Use the cheese you like - Parmesan, Swiss, Cheddar, Provolone, etc., a little extra is okay too

GARLIC CARROT DROPS

1 c bisquick

1/4 t garlic powder

4 egg whites or 1/2 cup eggbeaters

1/2 c diced green pepper

1/2 c grated Parmesan cheese

1/4 t pepper

1 c fine grated carrots

1/2 chopped onion

In a bowl, mix everything well. Drop by teaspoons onto a greased cookie sheet. Bake 10 min at 400°.
