The passing of a Knight is never easy

Every year a number of our brother Knights are called back home by our creator. They leave behind family, friends, and brother Knights who remember them in their thoughts and prayers. Often those people who come to pay their respects are unaware that you were a Knight of Columbus. Every brother Knight in good standing is entitled to have the council banner displayed at the funeral home. They are also entitled to a Rosary by their brother Knights. After the Rosary, a letter of condolence is read by an officer of the council, and it is presented to your next of kin.

You may, or may not have an insurance policy through the Knights of Columbus. Regardless, you should let it be known that you want your council notified of your passing, and whether or not you would like the banner, ceremony, and Rosary as well. Once we are notified, we will add your obituary to the newsletter, and make the necessary contacts if you would like the recognition you so richly deserve from the Knights of Columbus, and your brother Knights. Below is a handy little cutout to make your wishes known:

Call (586) 757-2626 as soon as possible with this information for the Knights of Columbus:

Your name,

The date of your death

The name of the funeral home

Circle your choices:

I DO / DO NOT want the Knights of Columbus involved.

If I DO want the Knights of Columbus involved, I DO / DO NOT want a Rosary. Note: Rosaries are usually held at 7 PM at the funeral home.

Knights helping others

Pray the Rosary

The Knights of Columbus are consecrated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Order fosters devotion to Our Lady and, in particular, encourages its members and their families to pray the rosary as often as feasible. This is why each member is given a Rosary when they receive their admissions degree, and we recite the Rosary before our general membership meetings.

Praying the rosary daily helps us gain an understanding of life's purpose, creating meaning and fulfillment. It helps us connect with God and improve the ability to discern right behavior from wrong. Essentially, praying the rosary is intended by Catholics as a means of spiritual growth.

Some other specific benefits Catholics associate with praying the rosary are the creation of peace, diverting the mind from material desires, increasing awareness and intuition and strengthening love in relationships. The rosary may also serve as a source of comfort during difficult times and is considered a form of spiritual protection against negativity.

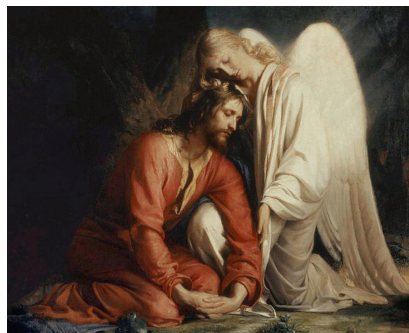
