# <u>Member Highlight</u> djovida, KJ6dj



**Q:** How did you discover amateur radio?

A: I had my first experience with radio at the age of 8 or 9. My sister

discarded a 5 tube super heterodyne, and I pulled it out of the trash and made it work. I took the tubes to an appliance store near my house and found the bad one. I bought some kits and began by making a doorbell circuit. Then a switched light. That led to Heathkit projects and ham radio. It wasn't until I went into the military that I found an interest in amateur radio through MARS. CW, though, was a requirement I didn't care for.



**Q:** What brings you joy in amateur radio?

A: My military specialty was air to ground/point to point HF radio, FSK and Troposcatter. After my military enlistment I tested and passed my FCC First Phone exam and went to work in broadcast radio and then television. When I retired, I became a ham to continue using my radio skills to serve the community (No code required). I enjoy EmComm, digital messaging and public service. I try to encourage people to get a ticket and get a proven method of staying in contact with others even in the worst situations. I tell newbies the "muscle memory" comes from use. I encourage practice to gain "strength."







**Q:** If you have more time, what would you like to do – ham or otherwise?

<u>7A</u>: When I get a clean bill of health, I plan to take an extended road trip around the U.S. Sort of a 'walk-about" with Connie, my XYL. I am also editing some videos that have been waiting for me to make time. I also want to spend time with my grandkids and great-grandkids.
