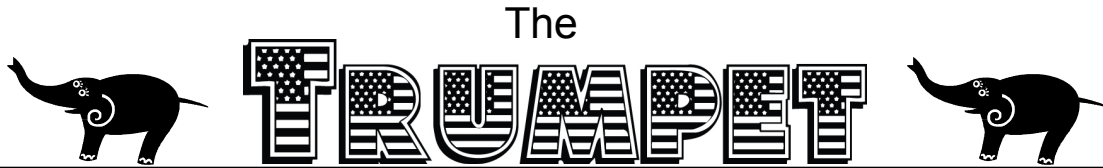

SPEAKER SPOTLIGHT

Born and raised in Southern California, Supervisor Lisa Bartlett has been a resident of South Orange County for over 30 years.

Lisa began her career in public service when she was first elected to Dana Point City Council in 2006. During her term on the City Council, she served as both Mayor and Mayor Pro-Tem for the city. Supervisor Bartlett was elected to the Orange County Board of Supervisors in 2014 and was re-elected in 2018 to represent the Fabulous Fifth District. She served as Chairwoman of the Board of the Board of Supervisors in 2016 and again in 2019.

In both her public and private life, Supervisor Bartlett is known for supporting projects she believes will improve economic development, property values, and overall quality of life. She brings that prolific vision to the Fifth District and Orange County at large, and is a strong proponent of fiscal responsibility, accountability, and greater transparency in government.

In addition to her role on the Orange County Board of Supervisors, Lisa represents her constituents on several regional and state boards and commissions. She is Immediate Past-President of the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) and was recently appointed as At-Large Member to the National Associations of Counties (NACo). She also serves on the Board of Directors for the Orange County Transportation Authority, Orange County Fire Authority, Transportation Corridor Agency (TCA), South Coast Air Quality Management District, to name but a few.

Lisa earned her Bachelor's degree in Finance, a Master's degree in Business Administration, and became a Certified PMP (Project Management Professional) as well as a licensed Real Estate Broker.

As the seventh of eight children in a community-minded family in Wisconsin, something in Matt Gunderson's DNA always told him public service is a virtue. Jung was using drugs even before she was a teenager. It was a lifestyle full of fractured relationships, disappointment and untapped potential.

Jung didn't know how to do life without the help of illegal drugs. She was an addict before she knew what an addict was. It led her into a dark world of multiple abusive relationships and the tragedy of losing her children to the foster care system. On several occasions she made efforts to get her life together but to no lasting avail. Homelessness was a way of life.

Jung even entered the Orange County Rescue Mission recovery program. It helped for a time, but because she wasn't really committed to life transformation, it too proved to be a temporary band-aid on a deeper problem.

Finally reaching the end of herself, God re-opened a door to re-enter the OCRM program and provided a Christian organization called Safe Families to temporarily find a family for her children to stay with while she worked on getting healthy.

Jung has subsequently graduated the recovery program, got an excellent job, secured a nice three-bedroom apartment and most important of all – her children are back in her care.

Deed and Truth was honored to be used by God to assist Jung in ending her long battle with homelessness by turning her house into a home.

House2Home (H2H) is a ministry of Deed and Truth. H2H partnered with their home church, Pacific Coast Church, to provide Jung with furnishings for her apartment and also handled moving her in. Their hearts filled with compassion. Our hope is that the members of Capistrano Valley Republican Women, Federated can partner with H2H and continue to offer help to those in need. 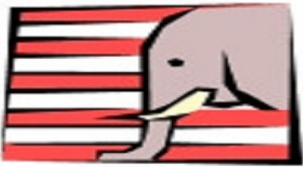
