Even with our Supreme Court of Canada win, getting our class size and composition language fully implemented has been a challenge. Right now, despite best efforts, too many of our classrooms are still in violation of our contract language. Effected teachers will be offered monthly remedy; but let's be clear, this is not a long term solution. We also face teacher shortages not only here in New Westminster, but across the province. However, it seems that for the first time in forever we are in a position to start bargaining locally again, alongside the BCTF at the provincial bargaining table. Many of our local Collective agreement articles have not been improved since the early 90s, and there is a need for some improvements.

There is a lot of work to be done this year, and in my new role as your president I am looking forward to the challenge and working hard on your behalf. One of my first official duties will be welcoming our new members on Monday, October 1 at Herbert Spencer Elementary for our NWTU/BCTF Induction Ceremony.

Specialist Teacher Ratios

So what is the restored language surrounding class size and composition?

Grades 1-3 split	22
Grades 1-3 multi-age	22
Grades 3-4 split	24
Grades 4-7	30
Grades 4-7 split	28
Grades 8-12	30
Shop classes, Home Ec., Lab Sciences, Computer	24
ELL 15	15
Band/Choir	30

District Specialist Teacher Ratios

- a) Counsellors 1:535
- b) Teacher Librarians1:702
- c) Learning Assistance Teachers 1:387
- d) Special Education Resource Teachers 1:342
- e) ELL (ESL) Teachers 1:61.4 (per funded ELL student)

Note:

c, d, & e are grouped together into a combined District wide ratio. These teachers are now called Learning Support Teachers (Resource and ELL).

Class Composition Language

- If a student is designated as high incidence/low cost or low incidence/high cost, the class size limit will be reduced by 1 student.
- If there are 3 students with special needs enrolled, the class size will be reduced by 2 students.

If your class is violation of these numbers after September 30, you are owed remedy. Please see a staff rep to find out more.
