THE TRAINING CORNER



Church Choir Etiquette ~Worshiping Through Music~

At the core of a church choir is a team of wonderful people who have decided to share their vocal gifts with the members of their congregations. Bringing unity to a group such as this will allow your **voices to blend** in a way that is truly special. It is important to remember that being a member of a church choir involves a *certain amount of dedication*.

1. Attendance

Singing in a choir is a commitment to God, the pastor, the congregation, the director and the other members of the choir. Your voice is just as important as the next person's voice, and everyone has to get used to hearing everyone else. If you miss two or more rehearsals per month, you might want to reconsider your commitment to the choir. The

decision is up to you. Please notify the choir president if you intend to miss a rehearsal. Additionally, if you are sick, plan to stay home or observe the rehearsal from the congregation.

2. Rehearsal Time

Three simple words: *be on time!* Special call rehearsals may be scheduled as needed and should be communicated as far in advance as possible. Please note, arriving late is distracting to the director and other choir members and causes you to miss out on potentially important portions of the rehearsal.

3. Be Prepared

Come ready to work hard at every rehearsal. It is important that your mind, body and spirit are prepared for rehearsal; rehearsal is a part of our worship. Be prayerful and attentive at all times.

4. Paper and Pencils

Always bring paper and a pencil/pen to rehearsal in order to record notes and instructions. Several songs will be covered in each rehearsal and it's impossible to remember from week to week the special direction for each.

5. Talking During Rehearsal

There is no talking during rehearsal, unless solicited from the director. Choir singing is a sociable pastime, and choirs are full of sociable people! The camaraderie in a choir is one of the most important aspects. Feel free to make merry to your heart's content **before and after** rehearsal and during breaks. It's really easy to start up little conversations with your neighbor during rehearsal. Such conversations are distracting to the director and other choir members. When this happens, the director has to either talk over you or wait until you're quiet. *Chatter slows down rehearsal and will result in early dismissal for participants.*

6. Attire for Choir Members

- Always be in uniform unless otherwise indicated.
- Uniforms must be kept clean, pressed and in good repair; hems must never be hanging.
- Never wear tight-fitting or revealing attire.

• Never wear bulky jewelry or gaudy make-up that will allow your expressions and appearance to attract more attention than the spirit of worship.

• For Women – Always wear a skirt with a length below the knee; pants are not permitted.

7. Strong Scents

Please be aware that many people are sensitive or allergic to strong scents. The deep breathing that accompanies singing worsens the effects of strong perfumes and other personal products.







The judges will evaluate eligible students based on academic record, reference letters, qualities of leadership and extracurricular activities and accomplishments. Winners will be notified by the President of the Tallahassee District Lay Organization by June 30, 2016. All decisions by the judges are final. No material will be returned. An application not completed in its entirety will not be processed.

THE SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

There are two different scholarships to be awarded. The Ralph L. & Joyce Wilson scholarship and The Eileen S. Warner Scholarship. Each recipient will receive a scholarship in the amount of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$750). Scholarships will be disbursed after recipients have provided proof of school acceptance. In the event the student is unable to attend school in the fall of 2016, the award will be returned to the scholarship fund.
