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RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING  
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING  
May 3, 2017

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Thomas Clark called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Scott Crandall, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Wes Howell, Guy Bakke, and Grace Bohall. Staff present: Town Manager Mark Campbell, Police Chief Scott Spade and Town Clerk Rhonda Shearer.

BAKKE MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF APRIL 5, 2017. HOWELL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES FROM APRIL 6, 2017 THROUGH APRIL 19, 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$50,469.86. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES FROM APRIL 20, 2017 THROUGH MAY 3, 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$90,707.58. WIKBERG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

WIKBERG MOVE TO APPROVE THE AGENDA. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Jim Yust presented the board with two new plaques for the cemetery. The old plaques were on the two pillars at the west entranceway, and one of the plaques has been missing for quite some time. He is also planning to fix the damage that has been done to the two pillars and repaint them, all at his cost. The board thanked him for his service to the cemetery.

The Board of Trustees adjourned at 6:41 p.m., and reconvened as the Liquor Authority for the Town of Kremmling.

BAKKE MOVED TO APPROVE THE LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL FOR THE MOOSE CAFÉ. CRANDALL SECONDED. TRUSTEE SCHROEDER ABSTAINED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

HOWELL MOVED TO APPROVE THE LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL FOR THE CLIFFSIDE PIZZA FACTORY. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The Liquor Authority adjourned at 6:42 p.m., and reconvened as the Board of Trustees.

Patrick Brower, representing the Grand Enterprise Initiative, gave the board an annual update. He has recently helped a business in Kremmling get started, and was working on a second that wasn't able to open.

The Mayor reported:

- For the month of April was at 139% of average for the water year.
- He and Manager Campbell attended a Local Emergency Planning Commission meeting, and a CIRSA lunch.
- He met with Sheena Darland, from the Grand County Housing Authority. They are currently looking into doing a needs assessment for the county.
- He gave Trustees Schroeder and Crandall information from the housing workshop that was held on April 29<sup>th</sup>.
- Wolford Mountain Reservoir is scheduled to be dropped 10 feet from July 15 to August 15, and another 10 feet from August 15 to August 31, so they can remove some monitoring equipment that was previously installed.
- There is a climate communities summit on May 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> if anyone is interested in attending.

The Police Chief reported:

- The high school prom and after prom party went very well.
- They will have officers from the county covering shifts while three of them are gone for a court case. Officer Jones will be on day shifts.

There was no public works report.

The Manager reported:

- Paving is scheduled to start tomorrow at 2<sup>nd</sup> street on Central Avenue, and continue east.
- The summer parks crew has started work this week.
- The computer at the water plant had to be repaired, but is fixed and working well.
